

KID'S MINISTRY

June is already coming to an end which is hard to believe! With that comes a few things for the student ministry. First, the **middle school group has their first event this summer Sunday night the 29th!** We will meet at church from 5-7 for some food and large group games around the church. Summer is always a great opportunity for students to connect and build relationships in the youth group as we head into the fall. It's also a great chance for the incoming 6th grade students to get to know others in the youth group and some of the sponsors who they will be with throughout the school year. This event is for all students who have finished 5th – 8th grade. If they are free, please RSVP to me so I can have an idea on the amount of food!

The high school group has a few Wednesday nights left in June as we continue on our "In His Word" series. Last week we dove into some bible study tips and tools that students can have to help build discussion, ask questions and dig a little further into the text. This week, we turn to a few things that I do for personal time in God's word. As we work through some of these things, the goal remains finding ways to connect with God in scripture. In doing so, I hope students can find something they enjoy and can build habits around. The statistical number is 4 or more. It's pretty amazing how life choices are impacted by engaging with scripture at least four days a week compared to anything 3 and under. It's not some perfect formula, but it is consistent and can make a huge difference! I love serving a God who continues to work through his living word in our life.

Finally, our mission trip is now under two weeks away. We have a group of 17 youth and leaders heading down to Waco Texas to serve the community there. As you find time in the coming weeks, would you join me in praying for those going. Would we be prepared, and open to the work that God will be doing in and through us as we travel.
