Hi Everyone!




Maybe it was Mother's Day this past weekend, maybe it is Memorial Day coming up, maybe it was the recent losses for some families in our church, maybe it is graduation season, maybe it was the wrapping up of another beautiful year of Sunday School, or maybe it is just something that happens to people "my age," but I've found myself thinking more about aging, legacy, and the impact of multiple generations in a community of people.
