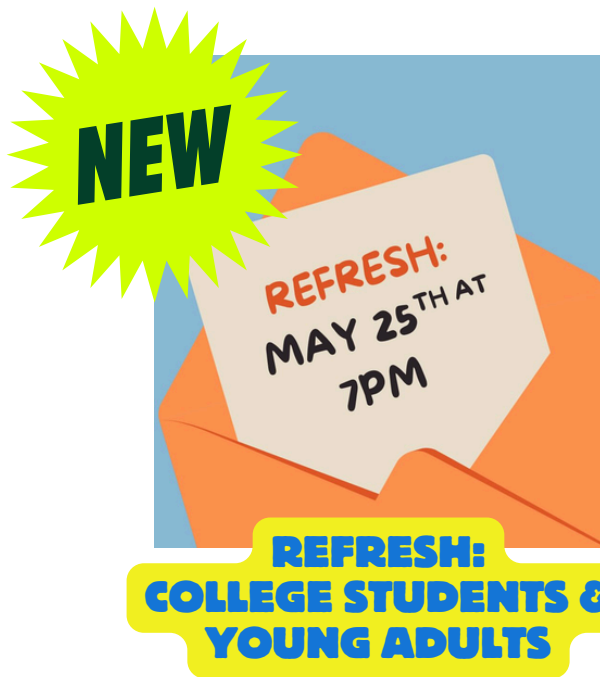

ADULT DISCIPLESHIP & WORSHIP



Memorial Day weekend is upon us! As I've often said, Memorial Day is one of my favorite holidays all year. I am so thankful we have set aside an entire day to remember those who are no longer with us who dedicated a part (and sometimes the whole) of their lives to defend America. Taking time to remember is a valuable practice. On Memorial Day, I also personally take time to remember my non-military family members who are no longer with us. My mom passed away on May 28. Memorial Day is always very close to that day, and consequently, close to my heart because of her. On Monday, we'll drive back to Burke and walk through the cemetery where we will see Mom's headstone and many others. And we will remember...

This year, I encourage you to take time to remember and thereby be thankful. Here are a few prompts and activities to try if you're struggling to know where to begin. These would also be great to do with children or grandchildren.

Take time to remember any stories you may have heard or read from soldiers who fought in wars or who have been deployed overseas. Thank God for their willingness to serve our country in that way. I am always in awe of those who have served so willingly, especially when so many of us have limitations that have prevented us from serving.

Take a trip to a local cemetery. Look for old dates on the gravestones. Think about what life would have been like during those years. How is it different from your life now? What did those people deal with that you don't have to deal with? Thank God for His gracious care of your life and the life of our country. Many countries around the world do not share the same liberties and quality of life that we experience. A quick international trip reveals this truth with ease. We are fortunate to call America home.

Think about how different your life would be if you had been born in another country. You don't even have to think about a 3rd world country for this to be an eye-opening experience. How would your life be different if you had been born in Ukraine? France? England? South Africa? Japan? What might your life look like? What would be valuable to you there? Thank God for the life you've been given in America. I recently heard a historian talk about the fact that in today's world, we live even better than kings of the past. Our present-day conveniences would be mind-blowing to a king from even the 1800s. We have MUCH for which to be thankful, especially in America.

And lastly, we also acknowledge that our beautiful, amazing, country is far from perfect, but we each have a role that we can play to bring God's Kingdom to America. Is there something God is asking you to do to help reveal His Kingdom to others? Is there a passion you have that requires action and the help of the Spirit?
