MSA the October 10, 2024 consistory meeting minutes.

MSA the October financial report. The 2025 budget meeting will be Wednesday, November 20, 2024. Reports from Liz and Heather were reviewed.

Curt Van Oort gave a presentation for Helps International for mission work in Guatemala that he has been involved in for the last three years. They provide medical and dental aid and provide stove and Bibles for families. Each stove costs \$300 and the total budget for Bibles is \$3,000. Curt is planning to participate in their 2025 mission trip.

The parking lot crack sealing project is completed; this is the first step of three phases to this project. It is estimated that \$100,000 will be needed to complete the pavement repair replacement, milling and resurfacing. Building maintenance projects were discussed. MSA to begin a Four Phase process for building/property maintenance funding raising. The first phase for the parking lot maintenance is \$100,000. Phase two and three is for concrete repair and skylight repair/maintenance. Phase four establishes a long-term maintenance reserve.

Susan gave an update on April 11 & 12, 2025 Transforming Prayer event.

ARC used our facility last weekend for their annual meeting. Next meeting will be December 12, 2024.
