# MIDDLE SCHOOL & HIGH SCHOOL



Our middle school midweek is starting this week and I am so excited to get going! The middle school group will meet from 6:30-7:30 on Wednesday nights, which is the same time for children's and adult classes. There is also a meal ahead of time for anyone who wants to join that is served from 5:30-6:30. Along with the main meals, there are also hotdogs available. Students are welcome to come eat in the youth rooms on Wednesday or you can eat as a family and they can come hang out in the youth rooms before we start at 6:30.

This month, the students will be going through a series on the gospel. Like the high school group, we will do this in three parts - Creation, Fall and Redemption. The core truths of these three weeks is at the center of what we go through the rest of the year - it all centers around Jesus and what He has done for us! This first week will be an introduction into the series, a chance for students to get to meet the new sponsors that are here on Wednesdays and get a feel for the small group set up.

The high school group times get moved around as well. We will meet from 7:30-8:30. Students are welcomed to come eat and hang out before we start. This month we are in a series titled "Gone Fishing" as we explore the life of a few of the disciples in scripture and talk about habits. This first week is an introduction into that series and will be a time to encourage students to think of habits they are already doing, or would like to create, when it comes to connecting with God. We will talk about habits around scripture, prayer and community throughout the month. Jesus is already victorious. Now we can continue to move forward and be encouraged to be "fishers of men" through the habits we form.

Sunday School has officially started. We are using the resource for parent discipleship that Heather put together last year for Sunday mornings. There are packets available to grab here at church. These first few weeks we are focusing on month 10 - creation. The challenge this week is for students to be outside and notice different things in creation; whether that is stepping into the backyard, going to a park, going on a walk or bike ride, or finding time to watch a sunrise/sunset. For some people, this practice of being in creation will be so great. For others, it will feel like a chore. The goal on Sunday mornings, is to allow students different opportunities and ways of connecting with God. As they spend time in creation, they are encouraged to pray and give God praise and thanks for the things that we notice. You can feel free to pick up one of the packets and walk through things as a family as well if you don't already have a routine of spending time with God as a family!

Finally, our October event will be the Heartland County Corn maze. We do this every year and is a great event for students to invite their friends to. We are currently planning on going out on October 20th at 6:30. I am still waiting for confirmation on that, so if that date changes I will let you know. And once it is officially set, I will send a separate email with directions, complete timing and the official invite.

We are fully underway for the fall! If you have any questions, please feel free to reach out anytime.
