Let me highlight the last of our adult Mid-Week classes starting in October. This year, I'm excited to announce that we also will be offering 2 classes that will focus on men's and women's subjects specifically.

John Blok is going to be leading a class called "Men's Life." He will facilitate study and discussion about what it means to live as a man who is focused on becoming more like Christ. And lastly, the class I will be teaching this year is "The Bible as a Whole." Mid-Week starts October 2 with supper at 5:30, and all the classes at 6:30. On the first night, October 2, all of the adults will meet in the sanctuary for an overview of the classes that will be offered. You'll get to meet the instructors and hear a bit about the class they will be teaching. Then I'll ask each adult to register for the top 2 classes they might be interested in taking. This will enable me to choose rooms and places where each group can meet with the appropriate amount of space for the class. Those meeting places will be posted the following week, October 9, at Mid-Week. I have always said that Mid-Week is the best place to meet and connect with other people from Community. I hope you all join us!

Calling all choir people! Rehearsals for our Christmas Concerts will start Sunday, October 13 and will run from 4:30-6:00pm. The concerts are December 15, and we will perform at both the 9:00 and 10:45 services. We offer free childcare during rehearsals, and this year, I'm asking people to pre-register so we can plan accordingly.
