### **Message from Pastor Sarah**


For you shall go out in joy, and be led back in peace, the mountains and the hills before you shall burst into song, and all the trees of the field shall clap their hands.

-Isaiah 55:12

When the Jews returned from exile in Babylon, Jerusalem had rested in ruins for 60 years. The land was in poor condition for planting and the crops were insufficient to feed the people. Yet, the prophet Isaiah reminds his people that everything has a purpose and when serving that purpose, its very existence praises God. The mountains sing and the trees clap because their very existence pleases God. Those returning to Jerusalem were being restored to their purpose and that was reason to praise God.

We too are returning from exile when we were forced to be apart and worship in ways that were unfamiliar. However, things are not the way that we imagined they would be upon our return. Many of our friends have not returned with us. We have a new pastor. We are the same but different. Yet, like the Jewish exiles, God is restoring us to our purpose -- to praise God, with our worship, with our work, and with our lives. This is cause for celebration.

Friends, we are a new creation, a new church with a new future and there is evidence of it all around us. We are truly blessed. So, let us do what we were created to do -- join with all of creation in expressing our gratitude to God!
