## Season of Change

We are living in a season of change, and yet much of the heart of our life together remains steady. Worship continues. Service continues. Formation continues. Care continues. These anchors remind us who we are, even as responsibilities shift and new patterns take shape.

Since Mary's retirement at the end of 2025, we have begun to live into a new rhythm of ministry. Some of what is emerging is clear. Other parts will take time to understand. The Associate Pastor Readiness Task Force has begun its work, and I am encouraged by the intelligence, care, and energy present among its members. Their role is to listen carefully and help us discern where our greatest needs and opportunities lie. This is faithful, patient work, and I am grateful for their leadership.

One change I have personally welcomed is the opportunity to offer more direct pastoral care. This is something I did often in earlier calls and have missed in recent years. It feels both familiar and new, and I am grateful for the chance to walk alongside members of our congregation more closely during meaningful moments of life, illness, grief, and transition.

In staffing news, we recently offered the organist position to Elliot Sander, who chose to decline. Our Personnel Committee continues the search, and in the meantime, we are thankful that Matthew Pechtl, a member of our congregation, is helping lead us in worship.

Work on our building has begun as part of the Shine On campaign, and you will find details in the update included in this newsletter. These repairs and improvements are important investments in the life and future of our congregation, and I am grateful to Rick Fiebiger and Shultz + Associates for their careful oversight.

This year's confirmation students are already completing their projects. One group recently baked and delivered treats to several members of our congregation, spending time visiting and listening. Another group is preparing to serve at Churches United in the coming weeks. Their generosity, curiosity, and openness are gifts to our whole church.

Plans for Lent are underway, including the hope of once again offering Holden Evening Prayer on Wednesday evenings. Lent invites us into reflection, prayer, and deeper attention to God's presence, and I look forward to sharing this season with you.

There is much unfolding around us, but the foundation remains strong. We worship. We serve. We learn. We care for one another. In these steady practices, God continues to shape us and hold us together.

## Shine-On Campaign Update

Repairs to the stonework in the sanctuary are nearing completion and are moving along quickly. Work in the music office has progressed more slowly after the discovery that the window was missing a lintel. Repairs are underway and are expected to be completed in early February.

At our annual financial meeting in late January, it was reported that we have received \$2.5 million in pledges to date, with \$804,170 already received. This total does not include the National Grant, half of which has already been issued to us.

Next on the schedule are plaster repairs near the windows in the JRR and painting of the music office.

Shine On kiosks are located at each entrance for visitors and members who would like to learn more about the campaign and offer their support.

Rick Fiebiger, our Facilities Manager, and Shultz + Associates, our project architects, are actively overseeing the work.

## Per Capita 2026

The Per Capita rate was approved at the October, 2025 Presbytery meeting and will remain \$50. This per capita apportionment is based on the funds necessary for the Presbytery/Synod/General Assembly to unite the work of over 8000+ churches into one PC(USA) body.

We will be accepting payments through the end of the year. Your contribution will be reflected on your giving record and will be greatly appreciated to help offset the Per Capita Apportionment payment sent to the Presbytery.

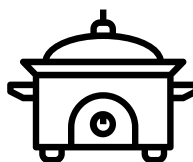
