### The Work of Christmas

What comes to mind when you read, "The Work of Christmas?" For most, I suspect, it's things like shopping, wrapping presents, decorating, cleaning the house, buying groceries, baking sweets, and cooking Christmas dinner. It's getting ready for all the guests. It's making sure the gifts are ready and everyone is receiving something they wished for. It's going to church on Christmas Eve and taking family pictures and just working through this list already has my head hurting. That's a lot of work.


For some, it's even more challenging. Because of illness or recent loss, Christmastime can be some of our hardest days, full of grief, sadness, and depression. For some, the work of Christmas includes dealing with emotions of hurt, loneliness, and disappointment. This would make any holiday "work."

I wouldn't be a bit surprised if on Christmas Day, after the gift giving, after the meals, after the dishes have been done, and the guests leave, there's a collective sigh of relief that our Christmas work is done. But what if it's really not?

In Luke 4, Jesus has returned to his hometown of Nazareth—His birth place. There he is asked to read from the scroll in the synagogue service. Jesus reads from the prophet Isaiah. It's a section regarding what the Messiah would come to do. *"The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, he has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor, set captives free, restore sight to the blind, rescue the oppressed, and proclaim the year of the Lord's favor."* (Luke 4:18-19)

This is a beautiful prophecy regarding the work the coming Messiah would accomplish for mankind. This is the work of Christmas. This is what Jesus was coming to do. Once Jesus read this, he closed the scroll and announced, "Today, this scripture is fulfilled."

This Christmas, our sermon series will be greatly different than the old telling of shepherds and wisemen, of angels and inn keepers, of Joseph and Mary. We're going to unpack how amazing this announcement was, not only for Ancient Israel, but also for us today. This is the good news of Jesus' birth. This is the Work of Christmas.



## GLOBAL IMPACT

In May, Hisportic Global Christian Mission celebrated 40 years of ministry to Portuguese speaking people worldwide. LCC supports HGCM and their work in Guinea-Bissau, West Africa. The work in Guinea-Bissau is currently led by Adriana Lopez and Ana Paula, both from Brazil. They work with Bethel Christian School which offers Christ-centered classes for Pre-K through grade 10 and adds another grade each year. This fall, the addition of 10<sup>th</sup> grade brought their first high school class. Adriana worked hard to get their high school curriculum approved by the government prior to the first day of classes. In February 2025, HGCM director, Tim Shields, is leading another team to Guinea-Bissau. They plan to finish work on the wall that spans the perimeter of the campus for the school, the Institute, the clinic, and the missionary house.

Ana Paula has also been working with the youth group at the Sao Paulo Christian Church and challenged them to read through the New Testament in 90 days. She was able to give Bibles in Creole to 19 teenagers who responded to the challenge. She has also been teaching in two different universities in Bissau. She views this as a God-given opportunity to be a witness to the good news of God's grace.

Please continue to pray for our brothers and sisters in Guinea-Bissau. This summer, during the monsoon season, there was major flooding and Ntuss Christian School suffered damage to its adobe structure. Poverty, the rise of Islam, and the influence of traditional religions continue to be issues for Christians in Guinea-Bissau. Pray for them also as they continue to reach out to previously unreached people groups. Preaching points and churches continue to be established due to their fervor and dedication.
