




## LET'S LEARN HOW TO PRAY FOR THE MUSLIM WORLD!

We want the Muslim people to know God loves them, and they are made in God's image. We pray for them to know Jesus as their Savior.

Use your Bible to read these verses to prepare your heart to pray for Muslims.

- » **While we were yet sinners, Jesus loved us and died for us (Romans 5:8). Remember, God loves Muslims and wants them to know Jesus died for their sins.**
- » **Jesus tells us to love God and our neighbor (Matthew 22:37-39). You may or may not have any Muslims living in your neighbourhood. You can make Muslims your neighbours by reading about them and praying for them.**
- » **We love, because God first loved us (1 John 4:19). Ask God to fill you with His love as you read and pray through this year's 30 Days of Prayer for the Muslim World—Just for Kids.**

## AFRINI KURDS



What do you like to carry around? Books? A ball? We usually carry around something special to us. Paul was a Kurdish man who left his country because it was in a war. He became a refugee, leaving all his special things behind in his country to live a new life in a new country.



In the new country, some of the women in his family became Christians. They prayed for Paul. He saw God do miracles for the women, but he still did not want to become a Christian. One night, he had a vision of Christ and asked Jesus to forgive his sins. That night everything changed.


Paul no longer wanted to carry the knives he normally carried for protection and his work. Instead, he carried audio Bibles! Many Kurds don't read, and that stops them from knowing God's Word. The audio Bibles read God's Word to the listener. Paul also used social media to post videos and stories about Christ and share Bible verses.

One day, Paul got a message online from a man who had questions about the Bible. The man wanted someone to meet with him and explain the Bible. When Paul asked, he was surprised to learn that the man lived close to another Kurdish Christian named Raban. The three men met together and that day, Raban was able to pray with his new friend to know Jesus! They have now started a house church to share Jesus with his family and neighbours.

Nadine had a Christian friend who invited her to church. She learned about God, who loved her. She was confused by the differences in the religions. Nadine read a book by a man who also left Islam and which explained why he became a Christian. When she went online, she found a Christian who told her about Jesus. One night when she went out for a run, she fell to her knees and accepted Jesus as her Lord and Saviour.

At her baptism, Nadine said, "I have so much joy, that I want to share this joy with the entire world!" She probably won't tell everyone in the world, but she shares her story on social media and shares verses from the Bible with the growing number of Muslims living in Canada.

When you are scared or lonely, what brings you comfort? Your parents? A pet? Samira lived in Yemen and found comfort using her phone. Her husband was away in the military, and she was home with her children. At night, while her children slept, she found websites that comforted her.

One website had the words, "Come to Me, all who are weary." Weary means tired, and Samira was tired. She wanted to know who to go to for comfort. From the website, she learned that Jesus said these comforting words. She found that Jesus Christ did what no one else could do: He raised the dead, healed the sick, and forgave sinners.

Samira used her phone to meet other followers of Jesus in her city. They texted Bible verses and prayed for each other. Samira had to meet with them secretly. She had to be careful because her husband's family would be very upset to know she had become a Christian. Samira went to her

brother's house to share with him about Jesus. She knows it is dangerous for her to be a Christian, but she wants other Muslims to know that Jesus can comfort them like He comforts her!



Other people came, took control of the land, and don't treat the Amazigh fairly, even if they are all Muslims. The Amazigh people have lighter skin and dress colourfully. Their name "Amazigh" means "free people." Sadly, they feel rejected, not free.

Let's meet Badida. She and her husband love Jesus and want to tell others about Him. Their lives are different from yours. They were once Muslims but are now Christians. When Badida goes for a walk, people say mean things to her. Their children are bullied at school. She and her children could be sad or mad, but they aren't.

Badida knows that Jesus makes her free inside, so she keeps loving the Muslim people around her. She is a good role model (that means she is a good example). She treats them with kindness like Jesus would. She tells them about Jesus. Many of them have become her friends.






DAY **6** FEBRUARY 23

What do camels, couscous, and Star Wars have in common? They are all found in the country of Tunisia. Some of the Star Wars movies were filmed there. Maybe you've eaten couscous. You've probably seen a camel at a zoo. Let's learn about Tunisia in Northern Africa, with a long history as a Muslim country.

When Imen was a girl, she dreamed that another girl put a cross necklace on her. She did not know anything about why people wear crosses. Do you? The cross is a symbol of how Jesus Christ died in our place to take away our sins. Later, Imen found a copy of the New Testament in her family's home. That was strange because that book was something Christians read.

Imen grew up and married. When a family member died, she was sad but remembered her dream of the cross and the New Testament. She wondered if Jesus was trying to reach out to her. On her computer, she learned about Jesus and decided to follow Him. She was probably scared to tell her husband that she was a Christian. Her husband loved her and saw how she acted kind and loving like Jesus. He could have been mean to her for becoming a Christian. But he did something else—he became a Christian, too! Now they both tell their families about Jesus.

## THE HAZARA OF WEST ASIA



Do you ask a lot of questions? Qasim did. He is Hazara, which used to be one of the biggest people groups in Iran and Afghanistan but are now one of the smallest groups.

Qasim was the oldest son in his Muslim family. He obeyed all the rules of Islam, the Muslim religion. When he turned 17, he realized he had questions about God that Islam didn't answer. He moved to Europe for a better life, but was lonely. A new friend invited him to a church that met in a tent. Qasim went and felt peace inside. He heard people talk about Jesus. They told him Jesus was with him.

When he started to read the Bible, guess what happened? Qasim found the answers to his questions about God! He was so happy to learn that Jesus loved him. He accepted Jesus as his Saviour. Qasim wanted everyone, especially his family, to know the joy he felt from Jesus.

Qasim made a quick trip home, but his father wasn't happy to hear that Qasim was a Christian. Instead, his mother and other family members wanted to learn about Jesus. Every Wednesday, he sends a chapter of the Bible to his family in a group chat. Even though he lives far from his family, he is no longer lonely because Jesus is with him!

# THE PEUL OF GUINEA





This hibiscus flower is used to make bissap. At Moussa's café, he serves bissap to his customers and tells them about Jesus. On the plate, draw what you would give someone to eat at the café. Color in the drink you would serve. Then pray for Moussa's customers to want to hear about Jesus.

What drink do you like to get when you go to a café? If you visited Moussa's café in Guinea, he would offer you *bissap*, a pink-coloured drink made from hibiscus flowers.

While you were drinking the yummy glass of bissap, Moussa would talk to you. What would you ask him? What would you talk to him about? Guess what his favorite thing is to talk about—Jesus!

Moussa belongs to a people group called the Peul. There are many Peul people in Guinea, but there are only a very few Christian Peul people. His family had always been Muslims until he became one of the first Peul to become a Christian, more than 25 years ago! His wife left him because she did not want to have a Christian husband. Even though he was alone, he loved Jesus and stayed a Christian.

Today, Moussa has a small café where he boldly talks to his customers about Jesus. He sits down with them and reads places in the Qur'an (Muslim holy book) about Jesus. Then Moussa tells them what the Qur'an doesn't—that Jesus died to pay the price of sin, forgives them, and loves them. Some people in his cafe have decided to accept Jesus' free gift of salvation. Twice each week, Moussa leads a Bible study. He loves the people in Guinea and helps them learn that Jesus loves them and wants them to follow Him.

Do you know all of your neighbours? Some neighbours might be fun to play with. Other neighbors might be grumpy if your ball goes into their yard. If you lived in India, you would have lots of neighbours. India has lots and lots of people. Most people in India worship Hindu gods but there are also Muslims who worship Allah, their name for God. Many Muslims live in Uttar Pradesh, one of India's 28 states.

If you lived in Uttar Pradesh, you might be like Rahim, a young Muslim man who just moved to the city. He rented a room in a big building. He discovered one of his neighbours was not Muslim anymore. Rahim was very upset that he lived next to a Christian, but he was also curious. He wondered how Christians pray and what they say to God. Rahim put his ear against the wall and could listen to what they say. Imagine how shocked he was to hear that they were asking God to bless him!

Rahim wanted to learn more, so he decided to open his door and become friends with them. The neighbours told him how to have eternal life with Jesus. Rahim asked Jesus to forgive his sins. He is living his life for Jesus now. He is a pastor, and many Muslims hear about salvation because Rahim opened the door of his heart to Jesus.

Ibu Asih, as a Muslim living in Indonesia, was surprised to get a new job at a Christian-owned business. Many of the workers believed in Jesus as their Savior. While she worked there, she had five dreams about Jesus. She told someone at work who connected her with some people who helped her study the Bible. She learned that God loved her.

One day, as she rode her motorbike home from the Bible study, she started crying and crying. What do you think made her cry? She started thinking about the love of God for her and her heart was so happy that she cried. When she got home, between sobs she told her family, "The love of God! I love you!"

God's love touched Ibu Asih so deeply that her husband and mother both accepted Christ and the free gift of salvation. After a while, her husband stopped loving God and sent Ibu Asih and her mother away. For years, they still loved God and prayed to Him. Finally, Ibu Asih's husband said he was sorry to God and to her. Now they both tell other Muslims about the love of God that fills their hearts.

## THE ZAZA OF TURKEY

What is your doctor's name? When you feel sick and visit the doctor, what does he or she say to you? A doctor helps your body feel better. Sometimes a doctor can help more than just your body. If you lived in Turkey, you might hear about a doctor who was different from other doctors. Everyone called him Dr. K. He was a Christian. He went to the eastern part of Turkey to help his people group, the Zaza. There weren't many doctors where they lived. Dr. K. helped them take care of their bodies and treated their sicknesses. But he did something else. He told them about a Healer named Jesus who died on a cross to forgive their sins and heal their bodies. Dr. K. cared for his patients' physical and spiritual well-being. Sadly, Dr. K. died. Who would help the Zaza people?

God loves the Zaza and wants them to know about Him. Ismail was not Zaza like Dr. K., but he was a Christian like Dr. K. He brought God's love to the people as he helped them get well. He wanted the Zaza people to know Jesus Christ as their Savior. When Ismail died last year, the Turkish church was very sad. Who will help the Zaza people be healthy in their bodies and souls? Maybe God is talking to one of the Zaza Christians to become a doctor and share about Jesus. Maybe God is talking to a Christian somewhere in Turkey or another country to go to the Zaza people. Maybe God is talking to you to pray for the Zaza people to learn about Him so they can love Him!

## IRANIANS IN GREECE



Layla grew up in Iran. She got married and had a daughter. Her family moved to Iraq where her husband died. She lost her job and had a heart attack. The heart surgery did not fix her heart. This sounds like a very sad story, doesn't it? But God wasn't finished with Layla. God loves Layla and had a good plan for her life, just like He has a good plan for you!

After surgery, the Christian doctor said, "God is healing your heart." Layla noticed a strange warmth in her body. She believed in God and promised to serve Him for as long as she lived. Layla and her daughter travelled to Greece. Along the way, God told her, "Layla, I have work for you. Look for and help those who have lost their way, those who are homeless." What do you think Layla did next?

Layla helped translate an online course called Al Massira into the Iranian language. This online class helps people understand the Old Testament prophets and leads the viewer to an invitation to follow Jesus, the Messiah. Layla works at a refugee centre, where people arrive hungry and exhausted. She shows God's love and offers to pray for them. She invites them into her home, feeds them, and leads them through the Al Massira course. Many of these Iranian people have become Christians.



Paulina grew up in the Blue Nile area of Sudan. Her family was Muslim. A Christian pastor had told her that believing in Jesus makes someone's life new. She was curious. When she was 18, she began to search for the truth about Jesus. Things changed when she asked Jesus to forgive her sins and come into her life. Her life really did seem brand new. Her thoughts were different. She acted nicer. She saw God at work in her life. She told her family how Jesus was changing her life.

Paulina moved to an area where refugees were arriving. These refugees had to leave where they lived because of the war. When they came to the refugee camp, they only had what they carried with them from their home. In a dream, God told Paulina that these people would change when they had the Word of God. She prayed with other women from different churches. She wanted to go to the refugee camps, but she didn't have any way to get there. She prayed, and God provided. Paulina found people who helped her travel to the camps. They provided audio resources for her to share. She visits women daily, prays for their needs, and tells them about Jesus. She feels happy as she sees God at work changing these communities.

## THE GILAKS OF IRAN

What is your favorite worship song? Do you love singing praises to God? Varesh does! He is part of a people group called the Gilaks. Varesh is a talented musician. At one time, he was homeless, lived under a bridge, and was addicted to drugs. His life was a mess until the love of Jesus touched him. It was a miracle that he stopped doing drugs. He was so happy that he started using his musical skills to praise God.



But something had happened in his body, and Varesh couldn't sing. He saw a famous singer using his songs to inspire young men to join the army. Varesh prayed that someone would use songs to inspire people to join God's family. His pastor said, "Varesh, you are that singer." As Varesh continued to pray, his voice started showing it was healed.

Varesh began writing poetry and worship songs. He also started pastoring others but was arrested and put in prison. When he left prison, he and his family went to a new country. They continue to serve the Lord. Varesh publishes his Gilaki worship songs and leads worship in the first-ever online Gilaki church! ## UIGHURS



Soliha grew up in a Muslim home. As a child, she felt a closeness to God. Things changed in her country and girls were sent to classes to learn the Qur'an, the Muslim holy book. She was excited and hoped to learn about God. The more she heard in the classes, the more disappointed she was because this wasn't the same God she felt close to.

Soliha's family became friends with a Christian family. Soliha didn't like this. But she was fascinated how this family followed God. They prayed to God anytime and anywhere. Muslims pray five times a day at certain times and must face a certain direction. Jesus' teachings about loving your enemies sounded more like the God she felt she had always known. It took nearly three years, but Soliha finally accepted Jesus Christ as her Savior.

Even though others in her class made fun of her for being a Christian, Soliha wanted other Muslims to discover there was a loving God and He had a Son, Jesus Christ. She knew it would be difficult, but she told people about Jesus. She was arrested and put in prison. While in prison, God put the Uighur people group on her heart. When she left prison, she moved to Northwest China where the Uighur people live.


# THE BANJAR OF KALIMANTAN







God knows the Millet people and wants them to know Him. Rahim knows God because of an amazing miracle God did. Rahim was a city bus driver. His wife became very sick and died. The neighbourhood women came and began crying loudly. The noise and crying bothered Rahim, so he went outside. He wondered how he would care for his children. After two hours, he cried out the prayer that desperate Muslims cry to Jesus: "Ey Isa! Ey Isa!" (Oh Jesus! Oh Jesus!)


What do you think this Arabic phrase means, 'Laylat al Qadr'?
