Stephen Ministers have confidentially served the need of support in crisis acute , chronic, simple and complex over the last 10 years at LPC.


Here are 4 stories of Care Receivers who have received Uniquely Christian Care from Stephen Ministers of this congregation of Lacombe Pentecostal Church.

1. One of our Stephen Ministers has observed that though her Care Receiver's original conflict is ongoing and unresolved, she has gained the ability to stand up under this burden through a growing confidence in God's plans and purposes. It has been a tremendous blessing to witness the miraculous faithfulness and compassion of Jesus in this woman's journey and the relationship with her Stephen Minister.
2. One of our Care Receivers came to us having recently moved from out of province. This man was suddenly and unexpectedly cut off from spouse, children and career, by separation. His calamity and rising panic of how to provide for an estranged family with diminished income reached out for a Stephen Minister to walk along side. As a Christian he battles with not understanding how this has happened to him and those he loves and where to go from here. Meeting with a Stephen Minister allows him to have a sounding board and the non-judgemental, unconditional love of a brother in Christ.
3. One of our Stephen ministers is into the 3<sup>rd</sup>. year serving the needs of 2 Care Receivers, coming along side their burden of addiction, fear and phobias, hearing their challenges, recommending resources and speaking hope into their lives, week by week.
4. Several Stephen Ministers serve some for whom group meetings in Grief Share was difficult and needed one on one patient listening, reflection and encouragement, until they could return to the group setting.

I honour these Stephen Ministers who, over multiple years after year have laid down their lives, putting wheels on their faith and bringing consistent care to people who have a needed to see the love of Jesus at work for them week after week. I thank also these Stephen ministers who biweekly come together in a Supervision (connect) group to share confidentially their challenges to meet the needs of their Care Receivers and receive input, resources and encouragement from their fellow Stephen Ministers – Thank You!

Also, the concern and generosity we received following the Cyclone disaster and towards our Christmas hamper program was unlike any year prior. Thank you doesn't seem enough.

Our December got turned upside down and priorities had to quickly be adjusted. But thanks to your quick responses we were able to meet some emergent needs to families affected by the cyclone that ravaged through our city and the entire island. We were able to provide drinking water, toiletries, food hampers, baby formula, meals for families, and take supplies to unreached areas.

There are further plans in the making to conduct medical clinics, mental health programs, provide kitchen necessities, and meet the needs of kids who lost all their belongings. We will dedicate some time in the month of January and into February for this. Details and meetings are underway. We are thankful that financial support is available thanks to ERDO (PAOC's Humanitarian Aid Org.) and people like you.

Christmas at the Bud Centre had to make adjustments to the festivities but on December 20th we put on our annual Christmas event. Then from shopping for the best prices, to delivering it to the Centre, and packing it all together. It's a big production. But thanks to our staff and volunteers at the Centre we get the job done.

## EVACUATED!

I am writing to you from a place I did not think I would be! We had planned to fly out of Cambodia on December 17 to be home for Christmas with our daughter and her young family. There was conflict along the Thailand/Cambodia border that we were keeping an eye on and had, up to this point, felt relatively safe.


On December 10, however, while meeting with some ladies for coffee, I learned of rumors that the conflict had come within 30 minutes of where we live. This was confirmed about an hour later when my NGO friends received notice to evacuate and to "TAKE ACTION IMMEDIATELY."

After discussing with the others around the table what they were going to do, I went home and told Carman. Still unsure of our next steps, Carman began to look at flights and I began to pack. I felt no fear, just deep urgency in my spirit. Feeling this nudge, we decided to evacuate.

We headed out to Rescue to hand over our house keys and say goodbye. As we pulled up one of the grade six girls, mournfully exclaimed, "Teach...no." How difficult it was to leave these loved ones. We felt as if we were abandoning them and with our "western privilege" able to escape while they were left to endure whatever was to come. Our hearts ached from both the guilt of leaving and the unknown.

As we drove off, we saw others loading trucks with necessities and evacuating. Military vehicles and First Responders sailed past us in the opposite direction. It was a strange feeling for us. Generally, Carman would be headed towards the danger. Our hearts went out to the families of those rushing towards conflict...knowing all too well the emotions they would be dealing with.

We were able to secure a room in our nearest city of Battambang and confirm our flight changes from there. The next day we drove down to Rescue One.

We spoke with Marie concerning her experience evacuating during the war years earlier while serving in Cambodia. It brought us great comfort as she expressed that we had made the right decision. Our friend Tong was also full of wisdom when he said, "You do not know how to survive in a war. We do. We can hide in culverts with water to our waist and rats swimming by. You cannot. Just as we would have no clue how to survive if we were stranded in a blizzard. But you would." His words gave us comfort in knowing with us evacuated, our director Thinnang would be able to focus solely on the safety of Rescue staff and children and not worry about us.

*We know how to survive a war, you don't! In the same way, we don't know how to survive a blizzard.*

*You do!!*

We flew out on December 12.

As we celebrated Christmas with our families, our hearts were divided as we kept an eye on the situation in Cambodia. News of bombings near places we would frequently visit, shocked us. Battambang, where we would buy groceries and where we spent our first night of safety, was now unsafe. We eagerly prayed for peace and we were hopeful to return on our scheduled date of January 7.

## NOW WHAT?

While in Cambodia in the fall, we started to notice a decline in Carman's mental health. He was experiencing some previous symptoms of PTSD and MDD. Twice, for a week each time, he was unable to help with lesson planning or teaching due to the severity of the symptoms. I began to pray, asking the Lord if it was wise for us to be in Cambodia at this time with Carman's mental injury. We had previously scheduled an appointment with our counsellor during the Christmas break so I began to write down questions to ask him concerning this. He delivered some hard to swallow news when we met with him.

"IF THE LORD TELLS YOU ANYTHING DIFFERENT,  
THROW OUT EVERYTHING I HAVE JUST SAID"




He said, "Any stress, good or bad, will aggravate the injury. From a clinical stand point I would advise you do not return to Cambodia at this time, and seek further

treatment." Our hearts sank. Then he added, "Of course if, when you pray about it, the Lord tells you something different then throw out everything I have just said."

And so, we prayed! Every time we did, our spirits would interrupt...we knew he was right and the Lord was asking for our obedience to stay.

And so, we pivot...once again...it is after all Carman's favorite road sign! We are spending the time in active treatment for Carman, intently reading and seeking God through His Holy Scripture and writing. We hope to return to Rescue in the fall. Meanwhile, we obediently wait, patiently seek, and eagerly listen for our next move!



# Church Membership ...

## What About Church Membership?

"I don't have to go to church to be saved. I don't have to belong to a church to be a Christian. I can worship God in my heart." Have you heard this popular dodge? It's sometimes difficult to refute because it happens to be true ... to a point. Nothing you do and nothing you can join makes you a Christian. The Bible makes it abundantly clear that Jesus is the only Way; that no-one comes to the Father except through Him.

**Q: What does the Bible say about church membership?**

**A:** The Bible is very clear that involvement in, and commitment to, a local church are essential for Christians. Throughout the New Testament the pattern of the Christian is to meet in local congregations (eg. Acts 2:46, 1 Corinthians 14:26, Ephesians 4:16, 1 Timothy 3:15). At some points we are commanded to do so (eg. Hebrews 10:25). Even Saul/Paul in Acts 9:26 – "When he came to Jerusalem he tried **to join** the disciples, but they were all afraid of him, not believing that he really was a disciple." Having said that, it is true that the Bible nowhere **requires** membership in a church. In fact, in Biblical times there was no such thing. However, the Biblical principle is that the church is a family and a unit. The Bible speaks of the church as a family, or the household of God. Church membership is not like joining a country club; it is about joining an organic family. Church membership is a way of being accountable and becoming involved in the church and in demonstrating a commitment to Christ by participation in the church.

**Q: I'm committed to our church, so what difference does it make if I am a member or not?**

**A:** "Times have changed from years ago when you could have a loose relationship with the church. Our society and our laws have changed." There are a number of key differences between people who just attend with no strings attached and the actual church member. There seems to be a deeper sense of belonging and often a higher level of commitment from the people who step out and want to be members. They are more ready to shoulder responsibility and encourage the ethos of the church. Members have the right to vote at church business meetings. This is possibly not the most exciting thing you've ever been able to do, but it does allow you to have a say in what the church does and how it functions. Only church members can vote for deacons (lead team members) and Lead Pastor when a new lead pastor is to be called. Only church members can raise queries and make proposals about issues at a church business meeting. They are able to vote and add input to the sale or purchase of land or buildings for the church. If you would like to have a voice in the way that our church is run and the things that it does you need to have a vote, and to have a vote, you need to be a church member. A knowledge of which people are willing to publicly associate themselves with the church by becoming members assists the church leadership in planning and effectively running the church. If you are a member of another Pentecostal Church and you have moved here to Lacombe, you can have your membership transferred.

**Q: How can I become a member?**

**A:** See the Application for Fellowship on the next page or at the Welcome Desk. When you find yourself in agreement with those statements, sign and apply for membership and leave it in the office or with a staff member.

## APPLICATION FOR FELLOWSHIP STATUS

### Article 6 Membership

#### **Section 1**

Persons desiring to become members of this church shall give credible profession of faith in the Lord Jesus Christ as Savior. They shall give evidence of compliance with the Biblical standard of Christian practice and manifest spiritual growth by giving evidence of the Fruit of the Spirit: "Love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control." (Galatians 5:22,23 NIV)

They shall refrain from acts of sinful nature: "... sexual immorality, impurity and debauchery; idolatry and witchcraft; hatred, discord, jealousy, fits of rage, selfish ambition, dissensions, factions and envy; drunkenness, orgies and the like..." (Galatians 5:19-21 NIV) Sexual immorality shall be interpreted to mean common-law marital relationships, pre-marital and extra-marital sexual relationships (1 Corinthians 6:15-18, 7:1-2, 1 Thessalonians 4:3-8, Hebrews 13:4), and all forms of homosexual activity, along with other practices deemed inexcusable for Christian conduct, and which place a person under God's judgment (Romans 1:26-2:11).

They shall indicate a desire to live in harmony with this body of believers, shall accept the doctrinal standards as set forth in the *Statement of Fundamental and Essential Truths*, and shall be regular financial supporters of this local church.

#### **Section 2**

Membership shall consist of the following:

1. *Regular Members.* Persons 18 years of age and over who fulfill the requirements of Article 6.1 shall be known as regular members.
2. *Junior Members.* Persons between the ages of 12 and 18 who fulfill the requirements of Article 6.1 may be eligible for junior membership. Such membership does not qualify for voting privileges at congregational business meetings.

# Water Baptism ...



## Water Baptism Information

Lacombe Pentecostal Church

### What Is It?

1. Baptism is a powerful, symbolic expression of the repentance that has happened, your acceptance of Christ as Lord and Saviour, and your commitment to being a dedicated disciple of Christ.
2. It is a public demonstration of a person's union with Christ and His death and resurrection. It comes from the Greek Word "baptizo," which means to *plunge, submerge or immerse*. It signifies that a person's former way of life has been put to death (*under the water*) and points to their new life, saved and redeemed by Jesus through His resurrection (*coming out of the water*).
3. Baptism does not save you. Salvation can only occur through the grace of Jesus Christ and His sacrifice on the cross.

### Why Be Baptized?

Baptism is a step of obedience, faith and commitment.

1. STEP OF OBEDIENCE: Jesus commands baptism for everyone who follows Him. Even Jesus, who had no sin, identified Himself with those who were repenting and was baptized.
  - Read Matthew 28:19, Mark 16:16, Acts 2:38, Matthew 3:16
2. STEP OF FAITH: You don't need to have everything figured out to be baptized. The act of baptism is a step of faith in what Jesus has done and is continuing to do in your life.
  - Read Acts 8:35-38
3. COMMITMENT: Baptism is an external act that signifies you are ready to embrace spiritual growth and transformation
  - Read 1 Peter 3:21

## What's Next?

### 1. What should I do to prepare myself for baptism?

- Spend time in prayer and reading scripture. Reflect on Jesus' love for you.
- Invite your friends and family! This is a significant moment in your life. Celebrate it!
- Ask someone you care about to come to the front and pray for you during the baptism (*No testimonies or long stories please. Just a 1-2 minute prayer and Bible verse*)
- OPTIONAL: Practice sharing your testimony (*the story of how came to faith*)

### 2. What should I wear and what do I need to bring with me?

- Bring shorts or pants that can get wet. Shirts are provided and you can keep them!
- Have dry clothes to change into after the baptism
- Consider asking a friend or family member to take pictures or a video.


### 3. Can my family or friends be baptized together?

- Yes! If each family member or friend understands fully what it means to be baptized, we encourage it! Every person who wants to be baptized should.
- Remember this is a personal statement of faith, not a family tradition.

### 4. How will this look in a service?

- After the sermon, when the music starts playing, dismiss yourself and head upstairs to the baptism door. Come down the stairs carefully as soon as the person ahead of you comes up.
- Please ask someone ahead of time to come to the front microphone to pray for you and share a blessing/verse (*Please ask them to keep this to 1-2 minutes*)
- Those baptizing you may ask a few questions and then they will say "*I now baptize you in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.*"
- You will be tipped backwards just enough to cover your face and then brought back up immediately. At no time will you be let go. Feel free to hold your nose with one hand if that will help you feel more comfortable.
- You will go up the stairs and can dry off, change your clothing, and celebrate this great moment in your life as a disciple with your friends, family, and the church.
