



About Deacons

What is a deacon?

Acts 6:1-7 is the passage often cited for the beginning of the office of deacon in the early Christian church. The first seven were called to serve the people, preserve the harmony of the church, and free the apostles to give full attention to prayer and the ministry of the Word.

In much the same way, the deacons at Connection Point Church serve alongside the Lead Pastor in the pastoral ministries of the church. Their service allows our pastors to focus on the unique ministry work God has called them to. Our deacon body is a service-oriented, consultative body rather than a decision-making or administrative one.

What do deacons do?

Our deacon body is called to care for members of our church and community, lead the church in living out the vision and mission, and proclaim the gospel to believers and unbelievers. Our deacons live out this calling by serving those who are hurting in our church and community, visiting the sick, caring for widows, serving the ordinance of the Lord's Supper, and serving actively in many other ministries of our church. Above all these things they are to be men of Christian character who exemplify spiritual maturity and the humility of Christ.

Who can be a deacon?

A deacon must be a male member of the church who possesses Scriptural characteristics and who is ordained by this church or by a Baptist church of like faith and order. The biblical qualifications of deacons are found in 1 Timothy 3:8-13.
