"The Pursuit of Peace"

Dear Church Family,

On January 22-23, 2026, approximately 19-24 Buddhist monks and a rescue dog named Aloka journeyed through Chat-ham County as a part of a 2,300 mile "Walk for Peace" that began in Fort Worth, Texas and will end in Washington, D.C. to raise awareness for "peace, loving-kindness, and compassion."

When they reach Washington, D.C., they plan to share a final message of healing and unity while petitioning Congress to officially recognize Vesak (a Buddhist holiday celebrating the Buddha's birth, enlightenment, and death) as a federal observance in the United States.



As they make this journey across the United States, they have been received by towns, cities, and states with overwhelming interest and support. As they quietly walk the streets and highways, they stop at state capitols, historic landmarks, and local communities to share messages of peace, invite reflection, and engage in prayer. In a press conference with the Huong Dao Vipassana Bhavana Center in Fort Worth Texas, the temple's vice president declared that their pilgrimage is not a protest or demonstration, but *"a journey to bring blessings to countless lives in a world filled with uncertainty and restlessness. The Buddha taught that true peace arises when the mind is free from greed, anger, and delusion. But this truth belongs to all humanity,"* (Fort Worth Report, Buddhist Door Global).

I must admit, their walk in silence has generated a lot of traction in the world with over 2.2 million global followers on Facebook & Instagram, while news stations across the country are capturing their progress on their feeds as well. When I arrived home Thursday evening, every street in downtown Pittsboro was filled with cars as people lined the streets to watch them journey to their conference at the Fair Grounds. Their presence has stated something very important that we do not need to turn a blind eye towards: **people are desperate for peace.** I have read the comments and heard the interviews of how people were blessed by their walk, their presence and the calmness they brought over their life in the moment. While I will not question what they felt, my heart hurts for those who do not know the perfect and indescribable peace and joy that comes from knowing our Savior. My heart is grieved for how many are lost, weary, and hurting in the brokenness of this world, desperately needing the Good Shepherd who will lead them to salvation if they would hear His voice.

We are living in uncertain, turbulent, highly sensitive, easily offended, anxiety-filled and sadly, inwardly focused times. People are restless, desperate, panicked, overwhelmed, and, at times, violent and reckless. Communities are fractured, people appear angry and frustrated with one another, and government seems greatly conflicted on the way circumstances are handled on both sides of the spectrum. The call for peace is appropriate because I think deep down, it's something that humanity is looking for inasmuch that they will turn to many sources to receive relief from those troubled feelings.

The message of the Peace Monks, and many other like-minded movements, suggest that peace can be found by looking within, detaching from the hardships, pain, and strife that we face in the world, and by mastering our mind. By adhering to a specific code of conduct or by finding purpose in our very existence, we reach peace.


I assure you, the point of my article is not to argue with the Buddhists. My point is to declare that the Bible proclaims a much different message. Jesus never said, "Look within and you will have peace." He said, "In Me you will have peace." On the night before His crucifixion, Jesus was surrounded by violence, chaos, confusion, and imminent death. He said these words to His troubled disciples: "*Peace I leave with you. My peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Your heart must not be troubled or fearful*" (John 14:27, HCSB). Jesus acknowledges that the world attempts to give you a version of peace that will not last. The world's version of peace is fragile, earth-driven, and largely dependent on circumstances. The peace that Jesus gives and promises is different. His peace in this world does not promise the removal of trouble, suffering, or hardship, rather, His peace is found in His presence, power, and faithfulness. Peace in Christ does not come from escaping reality with our minds, but from trusting in the Lord during it all. Jesus said, "In this world you will have tribulation, but take heart, I have overcome the world" (John 16:33).

Biblical peace is not merely calm emotions, but it rests in our Savior. This is where faith in Christ stands apart from every other offer of peace. Christianity does not deny the troubles of this world, but confronts it head on. The beauty of the Gospel is that God entered a world filled with violence, suffering, injustice, persecution, sickness and death and overcame it through His sacrificial death and resurrection. Because Christ conquered sin and death, we can have peace that comes from knowing He has everything and everyone under His sovereign watch and care. Peace is not found by escaping the world, but by allowing Christ to change your life, your heart, your mind, and your purpose. Peace places our focus on Christ and not on our circumstances. Peace is firmly rooted in the truth of Who Christ is and what He has done, and not on what we can do.

I will say, the Buddhist's walk across the country is notably inspiring. They have a mission in mind, they are dedicated to their purpose, and they are committed to their version of truth. But I must ask: *What if believers in Christ would anchor themselves firmly to the truth of the Gospel, Christ's promise of peace, and declare complete dependence, joy, and certainty in the sovereign plan of God in the midst of all the chaos that our world is in? Would that be a message that you would get behind? If I called upon Pittsboro Baptist Church to join me in a walk and witness to declare the peace that the world could find in Christ, would you join me on the journey?* Be careful about how soon you would answer that... you already know where eternal, real, and faithful peace comes from. Maybe it's beyond time that we begin to share Him (Christ, who is the Prince of Peace and the Hope of all humanity) with the world with our worship, witness, and our walk.







For those of us who love Karon's Mitford Series, we were thrilled she decided to write one more book about those wonderful characters from the small North Carolina town of Mitford.

My Beloved by Jan Karon

When Father Tim's wife, Cynthia, asks what he wants for Christmas, he pens the answer in a love letter that bares his most private feelings. Then the letter goes missing and circulates among his astonished neighbors. So much for private.



Can a letter change a life? Ask Helene, the piano teacher who has avoided her feelings for a lifetime. Ask Hope, the village bookseller who desperately needs something that's impossibly out of reach. Or, if you'd like to know how a brush with death can be the portal to a happy marriage, Cynthia will tell you all about it.

In *My Beloved*, Harley gets an important letter of his own; a broken heart teaches the Old Mayor, Esther Cunningham, a lesson long in coming; and thanks to Lace and Dooley, readers get what they've been waiting for: Sadie.




