Christmas Eve Candlelight Services -

Join us for Christmas Eve services at Riverside on Sunday, the 24th. The four identical services will be held at 2:00pm, 3:15pm, 4:30pm and 5:45pm. Bring a Christmas treat to share afterward.

All four services will be candlelit services and everyone gets a candle (as long as parents can stand watching their kids with their own candles ;0).

There will be no kids classes at any of the services (but there will be a toddler class staffed if parents wish to drop off their small ones before the service). Each service is only about 45 minutes long. We will sing and read through the Christmas story. We will have a (very) short thought from Pastor Ed with a funny and heartwarming video (that will keep the kids engaged) as an introduction to sharing communion together to remember what Christmas is truly all about. Immediately after communion we'll light all of our candles and sing a few more songs and then we'll all go home to continue celebrating the birth of Jesus with our families.

Here's a couple of helpful hints if you're planning on attending:

1. Show up early! Not all the services will be packed (our building holds about 200 comfortably) but a couple of them might be. I am no good at predicting which ones will be packed and with Covid it's even more difficult than ever to predict what will or won't happen on December 24th) so if you arrive about 15 minutes prior to the service you can generally find a place for your group to sit together. Once the service starts and the lights are dimmed it gets much more "interesting" finding a seat if the building is at all full.
2. Stop by the kitchen: We've got **free** coffee, hot cocoa, tea and if you prefer water you can get some cold H2O from the refrigerator door. There will also be Christmas goodies (like donuts and maybe some cookies and candy). And yes- you can bring it all right into the service with you.
3. Be kind to the parking lot attendants- We'll have some volunteers helping to direct parking so please be kind and courteous to them. We know Alaskans

don't like to be told where to go (even with their cars) but we need to maximize our parking if we're going to get everybody into the building that wants to come.

4. We are a relaxed and laid back group so dress however you'd like. Most people will be dressed casually (including the pastor) but some like to dress up on Christmas Eve. Dress however you'd like- nobody will kick you out for dress code infractions.

5. Don't worry: We don't single anyone out and you won't be asked to pull your wallets out and "pony up" to support us. In fact- we almost never talk about money and never on Christmas Eve so you don't have to stress about that.

6. We are kind of the poster church for "dis-organized" religion so if there's a typo or a mistake in this event description then you'll just be a little more prepared for when you come to Riverside for the first time.

1. The Shepherds Were Watching.

- *And there were shepherds living out in the fields nearby, keeping watch over their flocks at night.*

—Luke 2:8 (NIV)

- *But you, O Bethlehem Ephrathah, are only a small village among all the people of Judah. Yet a ruler of Israel, whose origins are in the distant past, will come from you on my behalf.*

—Micah 5:2 (NLT)

- *As for you, watchtower of the flock, stronghold of Daughter Zion, the former dominion will be restored to you; kingship will come to Daughter Jerusalem.*

2. The Shepherds Were Waiting.

- *Those who wait for the Lord will gain new strength; they will mount up with wings like eagles, they will run and not get tired, they will walk and not become weary.*

- *And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in swaddling cloths and laid him in the manger, because there was no place for them in the inn (kataluma).*

—Luke 2:7 (ESV)

- *‘The Teacher says to you, Where is the guest room (kataluma), where I may eat the Passover with my disciples?’ And he will show you a large upper room furnished; prepare it there.” And they went*

and found it just as he had told them.

—Luke 22:8-13 (ESV)

- *When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, “Let’s go to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has told us about.” So they hurried off and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby, who was lying in the manger.*

- *After seeing him, the shepherds told everyone what had happened and what the angel had said to them about this child. And all who heard it wondered at what the shepherds told them....
