One day an expert in religious law stood up to test Jesus by asking him this question: "Teacher, what should I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus replied, "What does the law of Moses say? How do you read it?"

—Luke 10:25-26 (NLT)

Observations On “Inheriting” Eternal Life:

1. It’s All About Love.

- *The man answered, “You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, all your soul, all your strength, and all your mind.’ And, ‘Love your neighbor as yourself.’” “Right!” Jesus told him. “Do this and you will live!”*

—Luke 10:27-28 (NLT)

- *You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, all your soul, and all your strength.*

—Deuteronomy 6:5 (NLT)

- *I am the Lord, and I command you to love your neighbor as you love yourself.*

—Leviticus 19:18 (CEV)

2. But What’s Love All About?

- *But he wanted to justify himself, so he asked Jesus, “And who is my neighbor?”*

—Luke 10:29 (NIV)

- *Love is patient and kind. Love is not jealous or boastful or proud or rude. It does not demand its own way. It is not irritable, and it keeps no record of being wronged. It does not rejoice about injustice but rejoices whenever the truth wins out. Love never gives up, never loses faith, is always hopeful, and endures through every circumstance.*

—1 Corinthians 13:1-7 (NLT)

3. I Can't Love Perfectly.

- *In reply Jesus said: "A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho, when he was attacked by robbers.*

—Luke 10:30 (NLT)

- *Then a despised Samaritan came along, and when he saw the man, he felt compassion for him. Going over to him, the Samaritan soothed his wounds with olive oil and wine and bandaged them. Then he put the man on his own donkey and took him to an inn, where he took care of him.*

—Luke 10:33-34 (NLT)

- *"Now which of these three would you say was a neighbor to the man who was attacked by bandits?" Jesus asked. The man replied, "The one who showed him mercy." Then Jesus said, "Yes, now go and do the same."*

—Luke 10:36-37 (NLT)

4. But There's Someone Who Can.

- *So now I am giving you a new commandment: Love each other. Just as I have loved you, you should love each other.*

—John 13:34 (NLT)

- *God made him who had no sin to become sin for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.*

—2 Corinthians 5:21 (NIV)

- *Mostly what God does is love you. Keep company with him and learn a life of love. Observe how Christ loved us. His love was not cautious but extravagant. He didn't love in order to get something from us but to give everything of himself to us. Love like that.*

—Ephesians 5:2 (MES)

Follow Through Step:

Spend some time this week reflecting on the parable of the Good Samaritan. Ask yourself if you're trying to justify yourself or if you are depending on the True Good Samaritan- Jesus.
