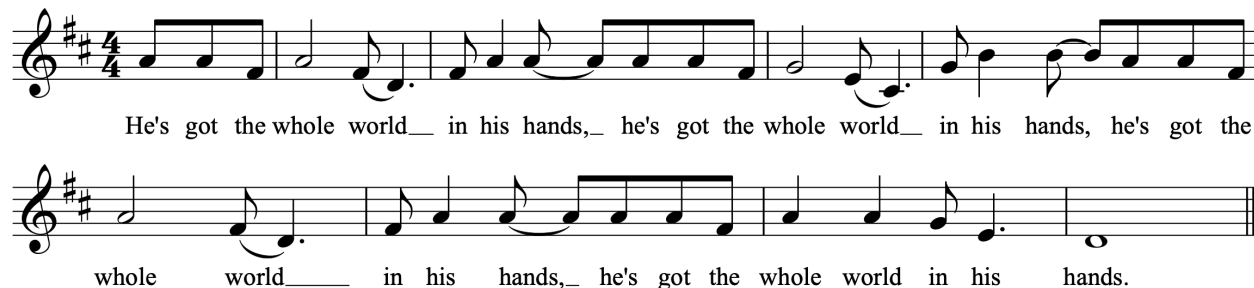

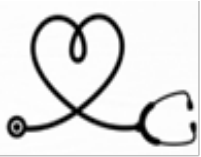

We'll provide all supplies, but if you have old photos (related to First Church or otherwise) that you'd like to additionally donate to the cause, bring them with you to worship!

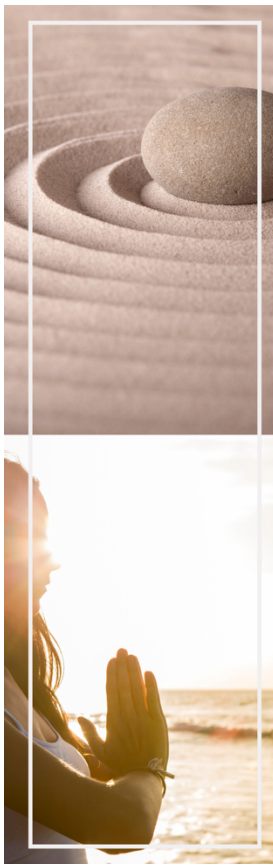
PRAYER SHAWL MINISTRY
