SOOTHING 2ND HOUR THIS WEEK: SOUND BATH THERAPY



With certifications as a sound healer, mindfulness mediation facilitator, health coach, and more, Lisa Cooper brings an integrative and holistic approach to helping people optimize their mental and physical health and well-being. From learning to let go of stress and worry to creating more balance and harmony in your day-to-day, Lisa uses her breadth of knowledge about how the mind and body work to offer a variety of tools and techniques to improve overall wellness.

Lisa says, "When we experience relaxation, the brain's wavelength is in the theta state – between conscious and unconscious, aka 'repair mode,' because our immune system is activated and endorphins are released, promoting healing. My hope is that through sharing the practices that have helped me on my journey, I can hold space for you as you navigate yours."

More on Sound Bath Meditation:

From Ancient Greece to Tibet, sound has been used for its therapeutic effects for thousands of years. Sound waves stimulate the vagus nerve, which connects to every major internal organ and is instrumental in regulating our parasympathetic nervous system. Circulation increases, and listeners often experience a sense of connectedness, contentment, optimism, and peace.

From Lisa, "My deeply restorative sound baths are designed to help reduce anxiety and stress, relieve pain, and support clients in manifesting positive change."

FOUR SESSIONS

OCT 27: Sound Bath Meditation with Lisa Cooper: an immersive, sensory experience of vibrational energy (sound) that elicits relaxation, shifting the state of the nervous system.

NOV 3: Taizé Singing Prayer with Craig Symons: short songs, repeated again and again, provide a meditative character aimed at praising God and drawing us deeper into relationship with the divine.

NOV 10: Tai Chi with Will Morrison: called "meditation in motion," gentle movement aimed to concentrate and balance the body's qi (vital energy), providing benefits to mental and physical health.

NOV 17: Guided Meditation with Derek Kolleeny: instructor's voice helps to focus on the present moment, producing stress relief, relaxation, improved focus and clarity, and enhanced emotional well-being.
