

Our Women's Fellowship

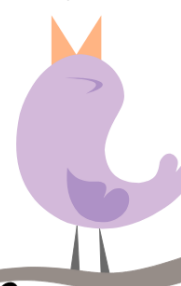
Kettle Quilters have been hard at work this past year. The colors are tones of blue and white, and it measures 80" wide and 92" long.

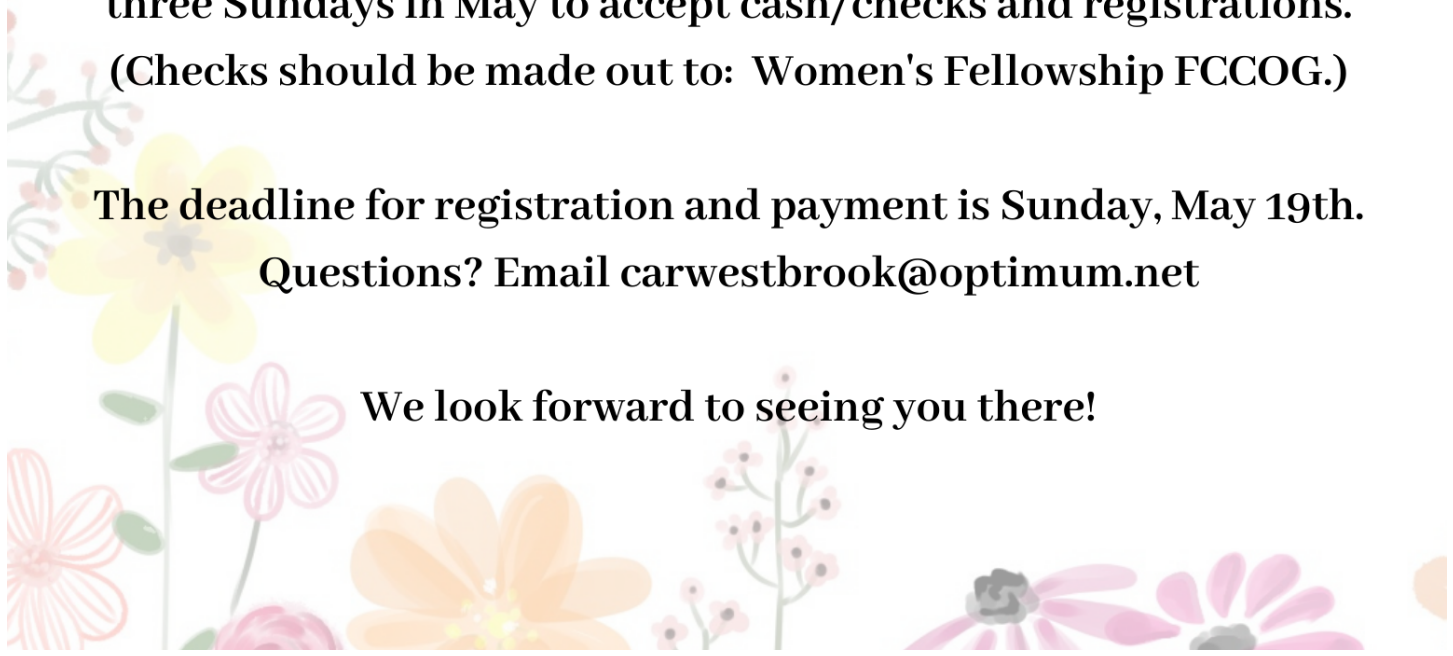
Women's Fellowship Annual Meeting Luncheon Thursday May 23 at 11:30 AM
