CONNECT:

This week we pause to intentionally celebrate mothers and Mother's Day. If you were to take a wide look at your mother's life, what would you conclude were her priorities and values? What is one positive thing that you have learned from her that you want to incorporate into your life and why?

GROW:

- What aspect of this week's text or message impacted you the most and why?
- James and John wanted to call down fire on a Samaritan village in Luke 9. Why does it seem so easy for Christians to hate, belittle, or ignore rather than love the non-Christians around them? Biblically what does it mean to love unbelievers who may be living a very different lifestyle than yourself?
- What truths must a Christian bear in mind when choosing how to respond to a non-Christian in their unbelief and sin and why?
- The Great Commission commands the Church to evangelize unbelievers and to disciple believers as they go about their everyday lives. Which of those two things are you doing well at and which of them do you need to work on and why? What does it suggest about the Christian who is never engaged in either aspect of the mission of the Church?

What is one practical thing that you can do this week to become more engaged in the mission of the Church? How can your Life Group help you with this?
