

## **LIFE GROUP QUESTIONS 2-1-26**

### **CONNECT**

In our text this week, the apostle Paul speaks of acting like a father among the Thessalonian believers. With that said, what is one noble characteristic you saw in your father and how has that shaped your life today?

### **GROW**

- What stood out to you the most this week from the service, text, or message and why?
- Paul appeals to their experience with him five times in the twenty-two verses that we've walked through so far. Who is someone in your life who taught you more by their example than by their instruction and what lesson did you learn from them? What lessons do you think you're teaching others by your conduct?
- Paul uses three words to describe his "fatherly" ministry among them – exhorted (to come alongside), encouraged (to comfort), and charged (to insist upon a standard). Why are each of them essential and what can happen in the heart and life of a believer if even one of them is missing?
- Paul commands believers to "walk worthy" in Ephesians, Philippians Colossians, and here in 1 Thessalonians. What does this mean in terms of your everyday life and what motivates you to do so?

What is one practical thing you can do this week to more faithfully walk worthy of God and the Gospel given to you? How can your Life Group help you with this?
