- Local Missions collected over 100 coats for our friends at Southern Pines Elementary School. The gift of a coat made one recipient say, "This makes me feel like I'm somebody."
- Five Brownson Youth participated in Confirmation and officially joined the church! It is a full house on Sunday nights during Youth Group!
- Brownson Kids welcomed hundreds of children through summer programming like Stellar VBS, Mission Possible Camp, Family Nights, and Community Camp.
- Congregational Care held a *Longest Night* service in December where 75 attendees who might be experiencing grief worshiped with candlelight and prayer.
- Adults in our congregation showed up in large numbers to participate in our two small group series during Lent and in the fall.
- Brownson Learning Center loves 77 children representing 60 families each week in the BLC sharing the love of Jesus with each one of them.
- Brownson packaged 25,000 meals during our annual Rise Against Hunger meal packing event.

We are grateful for the amazing people who are a part of this church. As we continue to live in this challenging time, may Brownson Church continue to be the hands, heart, ears, and feet of Christ. 



2023 was a great year for the Adult Discipleship Ministry Team. On reflection, we again recognized that discipleship means putting our phones down to discuss real life issues, studying the Bible, being together, sharing, asking questions, and being willing to listen and learn. Our approach was exciting and creative! During the year, we sponsored...

- Small groups that reflected on "Meeting Jesus at the Table" during the Lenten season, and in the fall, explored Psalm 23 through a series entitled "The Lord is My Shepherd: Provision and Presence for Everyday Living." We also organized several smaller "Connect Groups" such as "All God's People" for kids, youth, and adults during the summer, and other small groups throughout the year such as "Women of the Way" on Sunday morning and "Moms of all Ages and Stages" during the week.

- We partnered with other ministry teams and members of the congregation to augment our seasonal studies. For example, Denny Smith shared his woodworking skills by crafting a beautiful communion table. Jennifer Telles, a gifted ceramics artist, created a beautiful cup and plate for communion. In addition, a local artist created a painting of Jesus during his 40 days in the wilderness.

- We enhanced our continuing Bible study classes, prepared "Soul Care" offerings and spiritual direction groups, and helped with the fall church-wide retreat. In addition, we helped launch a first-of-its-kind "Chili Cookoff" in December.

- We began organizing a faith-based travel program which will schedule trips that explore the lands of the Old and New Testaments.

- We continued our coordination with the Bill Jones Committee to invite gifted guest speakers and preachers throughout the year.

## PLAYGROUND WORK & STEEPLE REPAIR



Significant Projects beyond normal maintenance of the Church and its grounds included new projects to enhance the experience of our children and youth at Brownson. Pictured here is the new youth playground which includes a basketball court, a gaga ball pit for dodge ball, a four-square court, and a hopscotch court. The gaga ball pit will be built in the spring as Wesley Little's Eagle Scout project.

Other significant projects included the repair of the church steeple due to water and termite damage and the addition of a fenced area for the nursery children's playground.



# LOCAL MISSIONS

TO MOBILIZE GOD'S PEOPLE TO BUILD RELATIONSHIPS AND ALLEVIATE COMMUNITY SUFFERING.

The Local Missions Ministry Team (LMMT) began 2023 with a budget of \$120K+ for funding our 12 partners: CARE Group, Food Bank, Family Promise, Sandhills Coalition, Moore County Free and Charitable Clinic, Habitat for Humanity, Boys and Girls Club, Friend-to-Friend, Sandhills Childrens Center, Northern Moore Family Resource Center (NMFRC), Tambre Place and Southern Pines Elementary School (SPE). Our partners submit grant applications each year requesting funding for needs from operating expenses to funding scholarships. All grants were issued as well as one-time donations to Adult & Teen Challenge and Camp Monroe to assist with repairs. To educate the congregation on LMMT Partner organizations, we instituted monthly Meet & Greet sessions during Higher Grounds so that volunteer opportunities could be explained.

This year Brownson added Adult & Teen Challenge of the Sandhills (ATC) to our list of Mission Partners that will receive annual funding grants from our LMMT. ATC is a faith-centered, long-term residential recovery program for those struggling with life-controlling addiction. In 2023, Brownson donated \$5,000 to help fund some needed repairs and upgrades to their dormitories on their main Carthage campus.

Our annual Habitat Apostles Build was a team effort with Village Chapel in April. Our strong volunteer crew worked 3 days in the house in Aberdeen, putting up siding, installing windows, etc.


We thank our generous congregation for the donation of 100+ coats for the children at SPE and Southern Pines Middle School. One young lady, who was helping her mother pick out coats for her younger siblings, got to pick out a coat for herself. Her comment, as she wrapped the coat around her, "This makes me feel like I'm somebody," will never be forgotten. Also, at SPE, we began our second year of Brownson Buddies Homework Helpers, adding some new volunteers and meeting every Monday to help with reading and spelling homework.

After a three-year hiatus due to COVID and the power outage of 2022, LMMT was finally able to return to NMFRC in Robbins to assist Santa's Workshop. Many former and new volunteers aided families in "shopping" for coats, clothing, toys, and books for children of all ages. LMMT is considering other ways we can assist with Santa's Workshop in the future.

Overall, the LMMT is committed to finding community partners where our grant funding can have the greatest impact and to look for ways that provide volunteer opportunities for Brownson members. Come and join us!

# GLOBAL MISSIONS

The Global Missions team once again hosted a successful Rise Against Hunger event in October. This inter-generational event accomplished packaging 25,000 meal kits to be distributed to those in need around the world, providing much needed nutrition in those locales.



2023 saw continued support for our Peruvian Mission Co-workers Jed and Jenny Koball. Jed had the opportunity to visit Brownson in November, delivering the sermon that Sunday and sharing details of his current mission efforts in Peru. Our financial support assisted in the construction of an additional classroom at the School for the Deaf in Nueva Cajamarca, Peru.

Global Missions funds were provided to support a student scholarship at Daystar University in Kenya - assisting with that University's mission to provide a Christ-centered education for future servant leaders in that African nation. Funds were also distributed to the Medical Benevolence Foundation to assist with the transformation of multi-faceted medical mission in Haiti and African nations.

Dear Brownson Church Family,

Happy New Year! As we embark on a new year, we begin this letter with gratitude to God. We want to take a moment to look back at 2023 and how God's provisions were abundant and deeply woven throughout the life of our church.

Although 2023 came with some challenges financially, we persevered to end the year financially strong. God's provision and abundance shined through with growth in new membership, we baptized nineteen babies and children in 2023, we had phenomenal intergenerational events like Rise Against Hunger and the Church Retreat along with an amazing coat drive for our friends at Southern Pines Elementary School. Our preschool has seventy-seven children that we serve throughout the week in a Christ-Centered learning center full of life and love.

On January 4, 2023, the church was struck by lightning and although we have a great insurance policy, some items were not fully covered by our claim. An aging HVAC unit had depreciated so much that our out-of-pocket expenses were just over \$20,000. Over Easter weekend, our steeple sprung a leak causing \$19,000 in repair costs and finally, the unexpected legal fees related to the personnel issue we experienced last year came in at \$75,000. The entire Session committed to slow down spending in 2023 to accommodate these unexpected and unbudgeted expenses. We received an unexpected estate gift and Session voted to approve that the gift remain in our Operating Fund to offset our deficit for 2023. Even with these unplanned expenses, our church finished the year with a deficit of only \$14,698. Giving remains strong and for that we are grateful to God's provision.

Our 2024 Stewardship Campaign was slightly lower than in 2023, but in line with our campaigns in 2021 and 2022. As of December 31, 2023, we received 274 Pledge Cards totaling \$985,592.

The Session of Brownson continues to be great stewards of all that God provides and we are fully committed to that again in the coming year. We continue to operate with no debt, healthy reserves, growing endowments and a vibrant and growing church community. For all of this, we are grateful to God's provision.

Over the course of the year, Brownson Youth has seen wonderful growth in Sunday night youth group participation. Over 60 youth have come to eat, fellowship, learn and have fun in the happily full youth suite.

The youth actively served their church and their community in 2023 through Trunk or Treat, VBS, Parent's Night Out, Higher Grounds, ushering and Sunday Serve. When the call went out for help, they answered readily and served with love.

Fifteen youth traveled to the mountains of North Carolina for the annual ski retreat while seventeen youth participated in summer retreats to Massanetta and Montreat and volunteered with Appalachia Service Project, trips that were life changing and formative.

In April, Brownson welcomed five new members from the confirmation class of 2023. The confirmands shared their faith stories, explained the scripture they had selected for their stoles and answered membership questions in front of the congregation as they publicly took an important step in their faith journeys.

# PRESBYTERIAN WOMEN



Presbyterian Women  
at Brownson Memorial Presbyterian Church

Presbyterian Women at Brownson will celebrate their 88th Anniversary March 2024. Originally known as the Women's Auxiliary, all meetings began with prayer, scripture, and singing the hymn "The Church's One Foundation." Held in the home of Millie DuRant, Brownson's first pastor, Rev. Ernest L. Barber, was also present.

These women were devoted to helping build a Presbyterian Church in Southern Pines while simultaneously assisting with the needs of people in the community. Originally named the Women's Auxiliary the name was changed to The Women of the Church during the early 40s.

Scholarships were offered in 1959 for a college education or divinity school degree.

In the early 1980's the official name became Presbyterian Women, and that name continues to the present time.

Throughout their 88-year history, Missions have remained a constant endeavor. **The Fellowship of the Least Coin**, the **Thank Offering** in the fall, and the **Birthday Offering** in the spring fund new and creative ministries that help build and continue agricultural development, childcare, community organizations, literacy, homelessness, and many times helping the most marginalized people of God's family.

**The Fellowship of the Least Coin** is a global, ecumenical prayer movement linking prayer and the least coins of many countries around the world. Setting aside the least coin as a token of prayer symbolized the oneness of women and their families, communities and nations.
