The Samaritan's Ministry of Hot Springs provides shelter, a comfortable bed, meals, clothing and a nightly Chapel service for each homeless man that arrives seeking assistance. Doors open between 4 pm and 5:45 pm daily. Men are required to be sober and clean and have no violent or sexual convictions.

A shower is available and they are given scrubs, clean underwear and socks as they prepare to go to Chapel. They are up at 6 am to get dressed, change the bed and have breakfast. The men help clean around the mission before they leave. This is their way of giving back for all that is provided for them.

The men are permitted to stay for up to 15 days per month as they are encouraged to find employment. Once employment is verified they are given up to 45 nights free of charge to return to a productive lifestyle.

Dwayne Shipman and his crew leave the Balboa Parking lot at 4:45 AM each second Tuesday of the month to make breakfast for the men at Samaritan's. They prepare eggs, bacon/sausage, biscuits and pancakes for between 20 and 30 men depending on the weather.

The Primary Election Report Card was a non-partisan, purely informational survey conducted among candidates in the Spring that had contested primary elections. The questions on the survey were of interest to Christian voters and included obscene material in public libraries; a government employee suing the state to keep pornographic books in public libraries, the candidate's position on the Arkansas abortion amendment, their support for making Garland County a Pro-Life county and the candidate's views on HSV being eligible for state grant money.

Candidate responses and non-responses were tabulated and each candidate was given a letter grade. There were no candidate endorsements.

Report cards were passed out to Balboa members before each service.



CHANGEPOINT PREGNANCY CARE

David York was the team leader on the Changepoint Pregnancy Care project. This project was so extensive the crew worked two weekends *before* the official Boots on the Ground Day.

The total project included replacing gutters and downspouts (approx. 70 yds); painting; repairing siding and replacing the soffit and some minor trim (bird box) work. The team also cleaned out all the gutters on both houses and patched a broken cinder block in the wall by the entrance.

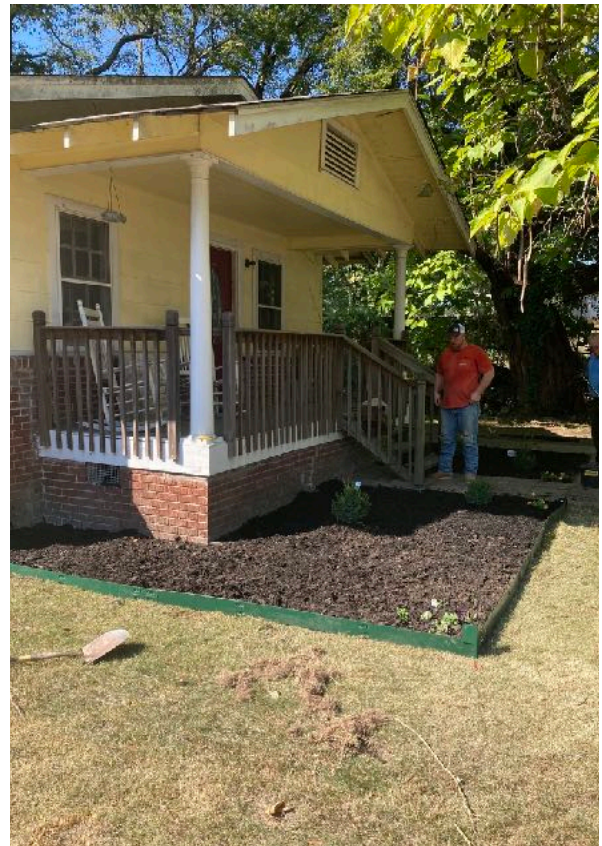
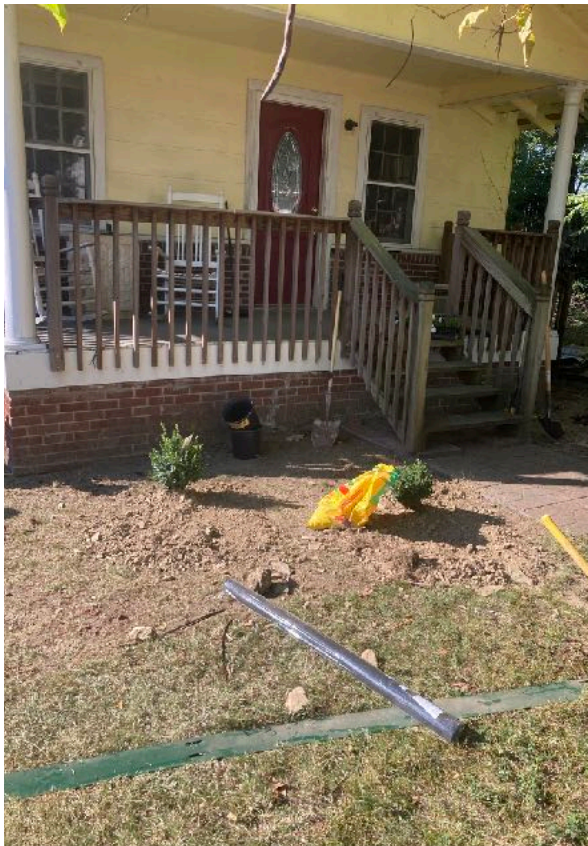
POTTER'S CLAY MINISTRIES

Kieth's crew included: **Caleb Dwyer, Garland McGhee, Darryl Nance** and **Corky Yates**.



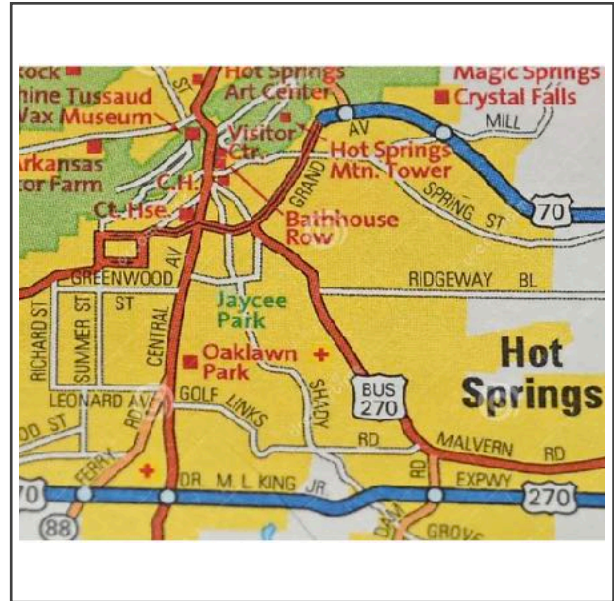
DELIVERY DRIVERS
