
MEMBERSHIP APPLICATION

Thanks for your interest in joining First Baptist Church!

We are grateful that you are prayerfully considering making First Baptist Church your church home. FBC represents a body of baptized believers who have joined together to worship, to receive instruction, correction, and encouragement, to enjoy fellowship, to grow in sanctification, to serve each other, and to evangelize the lost.

The pattern we find in the New Testament is that all who were saved would 1) publicly identify themselves with Christ by way of water baptism (lit. *immersion*) and 2) were added to a local church body as soon as possible (Mt 28:19-20; Acts 2:41, 47). We hold to that same pattern, in that order. We look for each Christian to have a clear and credible testimony of salvation, and then to have identified with Christ in believer's baptism (immersion)—or be willing to do so. At this point, the next priority is to become committed to a biblical, local assembly of believers. Becoming a member of FBC means you are following the same model, dedicating yourself to learning, growing, worshiping, and serving together with this local church family on a regular basis.

PROCESS OVERVIEW

1. Read our doctrinal statement at <https://fbcofholland.com/what-we-believe> and our Member's Covenant (2 are attached, one to stay with the packet and the back one for you to keep).
2. Fill out this packet. Tear off and keep the back copy of the Member's Covenant (two are provided). Then get the packet to the pastor or the church office.
3. We will contact you to set up a time for you to meet with the pastor for a brief interview and to answer any questions you may have.
4. You will then meet with the pastor and deacons for a follow-up interview and to go over any questions or concerns you or they may have.
5. If all is satisfactory, you will be presented to the congregation to give your testimony of faith in Christ; this is to be written down ahead of time, reviewed with the pastor, and either read or closely followed. Pastor will help you with this as part of step 3. At that time, the church family will be asked for a show of their support and blessing for your membership request.
6. Upon approval, you will be warmly welcomed into the fellowship as a member of the First Baptist Church.

III. DOCTRINE

Ideally, church members should be in alignment with what their church believes and teaches. At the same time, if a person has undoubtedly been redeemed by Christ and made part of the Family of God, and is not living in unrepentant sin, should we not welcome such a one? Those who are young in the faith may not yet know what they believe. Others may have come to slightly different positions on certain things. Some believers may be untaught or uncertain in some areas of biblical truth and sincerely may not be sure what they believe on certain doctrines. This is understandable.

In a growing church family, everyone comes in at different stage of development. With this in mind, we do well to remind ourselves that growth and the proper understanding and application of Scripture is a lifelong process which we are all in pursuit of, and this is as it should be.

At the same time, teachability and an enduring commitment to doctrinal fidelity are the keys. The Apostle Paul commended the Bereans (Acts 17:11) for their devout study of God's Word and their commitment to chasing and maintaining pure doctrine. We seek to carry that forward.

We recognize that some of our beliefs and positions in the doctrinal statement go beyond core issues like salvation. Yet, believing that our stated beliefs faithfully represent the clear teaching of Scripture, we remain committed to their adherence. It is our conviction that if a believer faithfully attends church, reads their Bible, and seeks to grow in the Lord, they will come to the same conclusions that our doctrinal statement affirm.
