Here's Mud in You Eye

John 9 tells the story of a man who was born blind. He spent his evenings at home living with his parents. He spent his days begging in the streets because there was nothing else he could do. But everything changed the day that Jesus and His disciples walked by. The man could hear the disciples asking Jesus about the theology behind why he was blind. But Jesus refused to engage in the theology of his blindness. Instead, Jesus spit on the ground, made some mud, placed it on his eyes and told him to go down to the pool and wash it off. And in that instant he could see for the first time.

The Pharisees were brought in to investigate the situation. They pressed the man and his parents about how this drastic change occurred in his life. The parents, who were afraid of the Pharisees, simply said, "Our son is a grown man, let him tell his story." The Pharisees, who were not fans of Jesus, basically said to the man, "Tell us the truth. We don't believe Jesus healed you because He is a sinner." Listen to the man's response.

He replied, "Whether he is a sinner or not, I don't know. One thing I do know. I was blind but now I see!" John 9:25

There are two ways to tell stories about ourselves. Our stories can stay focused on us, presenting us in the best light. Or our stories can put the focus on God by simply stating the difference He has made in our lives. Your testimony has great power. You don't have to have a powerful "prodigal son" story. The power of your story is found in the difference that God has made in your life and how He has saved you. So share your story with others. But remember that you are not main character. We all have at least a little mud in our eyes. Put the focus on the One who took away the mud and gave us perfect vision.
