

ONE THING LEADS TO ANOTHER

It was an unusually warm day in early December in Glenpool, Oklahoma. Krista was at work and would not be home until after dark. I was home alone and made the decision to put the Christmas lights up on our new house. I imagined how happy she would be when she turned the corner and saw our home all lit up. So I grabbed the lights and a ladder and got to work. It was taking longer than I thought because about every 5 feet I had to climb down and move the ladder. Then I made the decision to climb onto the roof thinking it would make the process much faster. I had to step on the top rung of the ladder to reach the roof. As I pressed up to the roof the ladder toppled over. In my younger days I would have just jumped off the roof. But I knew my knees and ankles could not handle the drop. So there I was, stuck on my roof with the Christmas lights dangling and my cell phone inside the house. About 90 minutes later, as it was getting dark, a mother and her daughter was walking their dog down our sidewalk. I shouted at them to come help me. They stood the ladder back up and I was able to make it back on solid ground.

Experts estimate that we make 35,000 decisions a day. Most of those decisions seem very unimportant. But every decision we make sets the course for the next decision. One bad decision will lead you down the road with the potential of making more bad decisions with greater consequences. Before you know it, you find yourself in a place that you never could have imagined. On the other hand, one good decision will lead you down the road with the potential of making more good decisions that may lead to greater blessings. That makes each of your 35,000 decisions very important.

Trust in the LORD with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight. Proverbs 3:5-6

One careless decision of putting up Christmas lights when no one else was home led me down a road that left me on my roof for an hour and a half. One careless decision in your life can lead you down a road to a dark place. So trust God and submit to Him. That will put you on a path that will lead you straight to heaven.
