From Pastor's Pen:

"See, we are going up to Jerusalem. And the Son of Man will be delivered over to the chief priests and scribes, and they will condemn him to death and deliver him over to the Gentiles to be mocked and flogged and crucified, and he will be raised on the third day." (Matthew 20:18-19)

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

In these verses our Lord Jesus invites His disciples to go with Him to Jerusalem where they will witness His beautiful, saving work and experience a crazy ride on the emotional roller coaster on the most holy week the world has ever known. In Christ's name I encourage you to come with us this year to Jerusalem and experience this emotional ride for yourselves. Especially through our Holy Week services you will be able to participate in the passion and victory of your Savior.

No other week on the Church calendar is as rich in devotion as this. The eight days from Palm Sunday to Easter saturates us in the awesome mystery of God's saving work in Christ. Attendance at each service enhances the spiritual impact of the others. To get the most out of Easter, plan on following Christ through the entire week. Historically, the week begins on Palm or Passion Sunday with the shouts of children welcoming Jesus into Jerusalem. They welcome Him with the plea, "Hosanna [Lord, please save us], Son of David!" From there we will witness the people's affections begin to turn away from Christ. As our penitential season of Lent reaches its climax, this serves as a fitting symbol of our own lives of disaffection toward our Lord. From Passion Sunday up to Maundy Thursday we complete our time of preparation with repentance.

The holy communion of Maundy Thursday marks the beginning of the three holy days. The services of these days are not really distinct and disconnected, but are a continuous remembrance and celebration of Christ's death and resurrection, His Pasche or Passover.

It begins on Holy Thursday when Christ reveals Himself as the true Paschal Lamb of sacrifice and institutes the New Testament in His body and blood.

It continues with the liturgy of the Cross on Good Friday. This is when His blood is shed and His body torn for us; completing the sacrifice that covers the sins of the world.

From there we move to the Vigil of Easter, the New Testament equivalent of the night when the angel of death passed over those in Egypt who had been marked by the blood of the lamb. For us it marks the time when death passes over us because the seal of Christ's tomb is broken. Christ rises from the dead to deliver us from our bondage to sin, death and the devil. In this service we pass from darkness into light with lighting of the Paschal Candle. We also remember, as the Israelites who left Egypt following the Passover, that we have been delivered out of our slavery to sin. We have crossed over to a new life through the waters in which our enemies are drowned.

The celebration continues with the festival of the resurrection in our Easter Day services. At this time the Alleluias again ring throughout the church to proclaim the victory we have in our Savior, Jesus Christ. It is a time for unrestrained expressions of joy. The battle is over, the victory is won! Our Easter celebration is the chief service of the year, and the pattern for every Lord's day service through the year.

Come, join your family in Christ at all of the Holy Week services. Come to see and feel the sorrow. Come to taste and witness the passion. Come to share and rejoice in the victory!

Vicar's View


Then the LORD God said, "*It is not good that the man should be alone; I will make him a helper fit for him.*" Genesis 2:18

Some of you participated in our Bible study over the last month and a half or so where we talked about community and not being alone. This is an incredibly important part of our lives, not only as Christians, but as people. Humans were created to be in relation with one another. This is clear from the opening verse that I chose from Genesis chapter 2. While this is a verse that normally has a marriage and wedding connotation to it, the same can be said of us as members of the body of Christ. Paul affirms this for us as he writes, "we were all baptized into one body, whether Jews or Greeks, whether slaves or free." This verse speaks of the vertical component of this "body" relationship that we share with one another. Through our common baptism, we are all joined together as one in Christ and are sustained by this in the sacrament. However, there are some of us who are unable to receive it. This is a tragedy and changing that reality should be one of our highest priorities. Encourage your brothers and sisters to join us, bring them back to the altar whereby they may receive the soul-strengthening body and blood of our Lord.

While we spoke about the vertical aspect of the "body" relationship we have, there is also a horizontal component as well. As members of the body of Christ, we are made to live together. This is not just a simple saying 'hi' in the parking lot before or after service, this is an intimate knowing of each other, sharing each other's spiritual loads, and working as one to accomplish God's mission in this world. This has been hard over the last year or so as we have been in the midst of a global pandemic, but there has been a streak of hope looming on the horizon for some time now. Thanks to the work of our political leaders, both the previous administration and the current, and leaders within the FDA, we have been provided a vaccine much more quickly than would normally have been the case. This vaccine, coupled with the numbers of people who have already had the virus, has allowed our transmission and positivity numbers to drop rapidly. What a blessing this is!

But now, as we see these changes occurring, we need to look back at how we have been practicing community over the past year or so. Due to circumstances, we have had to create division to ensure the safety of our flock. We have been forced to shatter the community that our Lord had planned for us to prevent the rampant spread of disease and possible death. But now that things are returning to a state of normal we must give heed to Paul as he writes, "so that there may be no division in the body." He is speaking more about the superficial divisions that were created over issues within the church, but the same could be said of our practice. It is time for us to get back to worshipping as one, to join together and celebrate this paschal season together in unity.

While this may scare some of us, Paul goes on to say in that verse I just referenced that, "if one member suffers, all the members suffer with it; if one member is honored, all the members rejoice with it." This could go on to say that if one is scared, we all support them and reassure them. This may take the form of additional protections or safeguards, but our priority now needs to shift towards unity and worship together. Let us move towards the cross this Lenten season as one, with everyone together celebrating his supper as a church, unified around our concern and care for one another.



“This conference is for everyone,” explains Life Ministry Director Deaconess Tiffany Manor. “The pandemic constraints have given us an opportunity to share presentations by many experts with students of all ages, missionaries, church workers and congregation members who couldn’t make it to previous in-person events.” And that includes you!

Conference sessions will help you explore a distinctly Lutheran understanding of the sanctity of human life, specifically as it pertains to:

- Speaking for life in the public square;
- Caring for life in your community; and
- Teaching about human life.

From the Seminary

Dr. Thomas J. Egger, the Gustav and Sophie Butterbach Professor of Exegetical Theology and chairman of the Department of Exegetical Theology at Concordia Seminary, has accepted the call to serve as the 11th president of Concordia Seminary, St. Louis. Egger announced his formal acceptance of the call after chapel service today.

“It is with a lot of joy and anticipation, and also with some trembling and prayers to God for grace and wisdom, that I announce today the acceptance of this call,” he said. “The Lord has been so kind to me, in calling a poor, miserable sinner to speak in His name, and to serve His bride, His dear church, first as a parish pastor at Zion Lutheran Church in Storm Lake, Iowa. Those were wonderful years that I will never forget. For the last 16 years as an Old Testament professor here, studying the sacred Scriptures with many of you — also wonderful years that I will never forget. And now, He has called me to serve His dear church as Seminary president, and to lead this renowned Seminary into the heart of the 21st century.”

Egger will transition to his new role in mid-March, and his formal installation is expected to be in August.
