## Street Reach - Cold Streets!

Street Reach is our outreach ministry to those living on the streets, in parking lots, in parks, under bridges and more. We look to make a connection with them, offer some simple resources, and work to connect them to permanent housing and other support from within our community.

The cold temperatures in January took a toll on our neighbors, with many staying in vehicles with temperatures in the single digits. Thankfully, the **Idaho Community Foundation** agreed to redirect a grant of \$3,000 to be used for hotel nights for our neighbors. In addition to those individuals we served, we invited Pocatello Police to bring anyone they found on the streets at night to the hotel to get them safe and secure. As you can imagine, with many nights in the single digits and below zero, those funds were put to use and quickly spent. We were blessed with another gift from the **Simplot Company** in the latter part of January with an additional \$2,000, which allowed us to continue a few more nights just before the 'warm up' at the end of the month.

As I have often said, we live in an amazing, generous community! When there is a need, we rise to the occasion - and our neighbors are more than appreciative.

We continue to connect and direct people to resources that will help move them from the streets to success. It takes time and trust - and it's worth every minute we invest!
