Street Reach - The Current State of Homelessness

Street Reach is our outreach ministry to those living on the streets, in parking lots, in parks, under bridges and more. We look to make a connection with them, offer some simple resources, and work to connect them to permanent housing and other support from within the community.

The recent report released by the Department of Housing and Urban Development's (HUD) Annual Homelessness report revealed a sobering reality: homelessness continues to rise at an alarming rate. Data shows an increase in homelessness of 18% nationwide, on top of the 11% increase in 2023. This is an issue not reserved just for big cities or poor neighborhoods. This is the reality of life in Pocatello, and it is only going to increase unless several things change in our community.

First, we all have to recognize this reality. We ask - "Do you know their story?" It is too easy to judge and assume that the person we see is taking advantage of the system, is just lazy, or a myriad of other issues. Do you know the trauma they went through? Do you understand how addiction works and messes with the mind? Second, we all need to work together to create solutions and opportunities for those who want to change their situation. I often tell people that Valley Mission's programs are not the solution, only *part* of the solution. It will take all of us to make this change a reality.

The primary goal of Street Reach teams is to create a bridge of trust. We do this by repetition and offering resources. Seeing them often, pointing them to the help they need, going with them to appointments - all in an effort to earn their trust now. Once we gain that, and when our building is open (THIS FALL), then we can begin to change lives and offer hope and healing.

Food Pantry

Another big year of blessing people with food and other needed items. Our local stores - 14 of them in total - have been very supportive and generous in their donations. We distributed over 400,000 pounds of food again this year and served more than 32,000 people (that's 8600+ families).

None of this happens without an amazing team of volunteers and volunteer leaders! More than 80 people have given well over 6,500 hours to bless our community. WOW! Our team of drivers is out early every Wednesday and Thursday and makes the work of collecting the food look easy - which it is not.

Street Reach and MAP

Our Street Reach teams have been in and out of the community on a fairly regular basis. We did have a lull in August and September as we transitioned some leadership and rebuilt teams, but have been able to get back on track connecting this population. We visited just under 100 encampments throughout our first year, seeing at least a couple of people get off the streets and into more permanent housing or relocating to a safe community.

MAP (Mobile Access Partnership) is a collaboration of services by local partner agencies. We bring these agencies to one location so our neighbors can access multiple services at once in a safe, non-threatening environment. This takes place from spring until fall. This was our first year offering this and was less than what we hoped for. Of course anytime you try something new there is a learning curve, or in this case a trust curve that has to be navigated.

We did have great partnerships with the Free Clinic, The Rock Church, a traveling veterinarian, Dept. of Health, Center for Hope South and others. With their support we were able to assist just under 20 individuals with care, support and aid.
