Case Management On The Street

In the previous few editions of Mission Minute we introduced you to our Street Reach program. This month we want to dive in deeper to what it means to do case management with the neighbors we meet.

In the last two months our Street Reach Team has located 14 different camp sites. These sites are all in one area of town. We know of others in different parts of town but we have to be realistic about how many people we can serve well with our current resources.

In these 14 camps we have begun case management with our neighbors. We have been able to help them connect with medical services and provide hope when things are extra dark. One such story is of Julie (not her real name). Julie had been living in her van unable to partake in shelter services because she lacked an ID. Julie found herself stranded after her significant other had been incarcerated in another state. Julie had no support system and was dealing with significant mental health and developmental issues.

The Valley Mission Street reach team had started checking in on Julie each week. One week when our team showed up Julie was out of hope. She believed a life line was coming to save her and it had been ripped away. In her darkness our team showed up and reminded her that she is not alone. We increased the frequency of our check-ins and worked with her to get stabilized again. Julie is doing better today because God put us in a place to help her at just the right time.

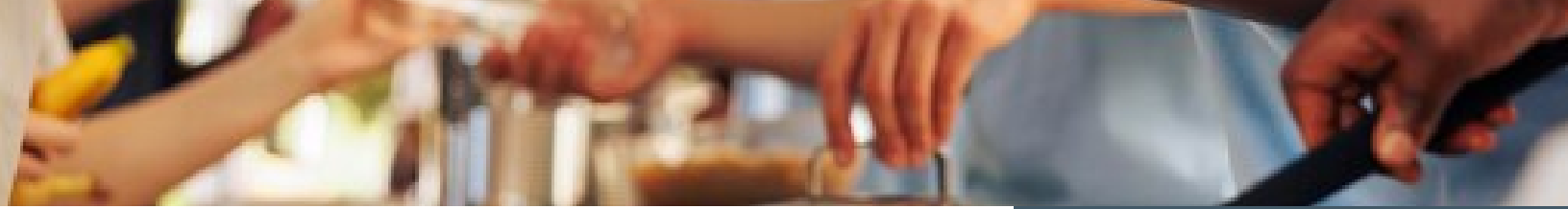

Building Update

Construction continues to gain momentum. Preparation for sewer lines is under way with trenching and installing lines. Steel beams have arrived and are being installed in the emergency shelter space. This has a two-fold purpose: to expand the shelter space allowing for extra beds, and provide proper support for the 2nd story office spaces which will house partner agencies. Then on to general framing for the food pantry area and Clinic space. Very exciting to watch this become a reality!
