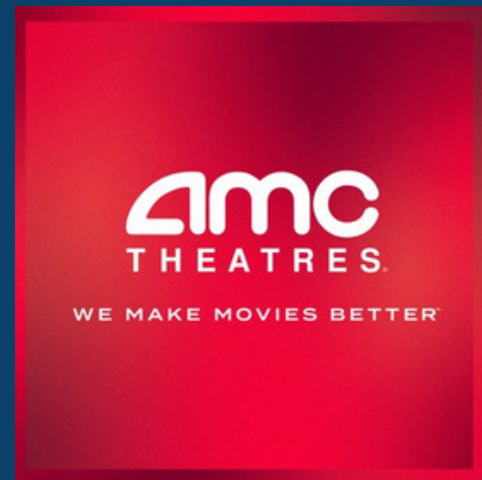

## Construction Progress

In this new format, we will update you on all things construction. From what is being worked on now, to upcoming important dates and challenges, we'll keep you up to date as best we can.

## Recent Progress

- The roof is done! The crew worked hard through some of the coldest winter days we had, and got it done in under 2 weeks. Zach and his crew are the best and were a joy to work with. And it was sure nice not to have to deal with leaks when the last snow started melting!
- Framing is just about complete throughout the building. The final office space and wall on the main floor are the biggest pieces left there.

## In Progress

- Still waiting on fire sprinkler group to get on site for estimates. and then timing on when work can begin.
- As funds come in, we will begin to pull electrical into Food Pantry area as well as finalize plumbing in the same area.



Our new Food Pantry area will allow us to move more people through and will give us an opportunity to explore new ways to serve some of our more vulnerable guests.

We are also working with Pocatello High School to help design some fun murals for the walls in the Food Pantry area and the laundromat!





## Food Pantry Bites

A new feature where we will highlight many of the people, groups, businesses and supporters of the Food Pantry. It takes a lot of people and partnership to make this operation a success. We'll share some of the people and pieces here.

## Pantry Tid-bits:

- Each month the Food Pantry serves an average of 200 households every Thursday, with an average household size of 4 people. That equates to 700 people weekly.
- We pick up donated food from 14 stores and receive food from the Idaho Foodbank weekly. That equates to 4,000 to 10,000 pounds of food we can distribute every week.
- The Food Pantry team is 100% volunteer led. Volunteers come from all over the community as well as First Baptist Church. More than 70 volunteers give their time and sweat to make this happen.
- Fun Fact: of the volunteers, more than 60% are from outside the First Baptist Family.

## Food Pantry Opportunities

There are a few ways to serve in the Food Pantry:

Wednesdays, 8 am – 11:30 am

Food is delivered from our 14 stores as well as from the Idaho Foodbank. Unloading, sorting, organizing and building food boxes takes place on this day.

Thursdays, 10 am to 11 am

Additional food deliveries from some of the same stores. Unloading, sorting and organizing takes place here.

Thursdays, 3:30 to 6 pm

Food is distributed to the community. Most 'jobs' deal with serving the guest as well as carrying boxes to their vehicles.
