Record Numbers

Over the last several months the food pantry has seen record numbers. Most weeks we serve over 200 guests. Of those 200 guests, an average of 20 will be first time guests, 40% use our service twice per month and the rest utilize us weekly.

In addition to receiving much needed food our guests also develop relationships with our staff and volunteers. Within the safety of these relationships we have the opportunity to hear the challenges of some of our guests. In addition to providing a listening ear and spiritual support we also work to connect our guests with other local agencies that can help meet their felt needs.

Many of our guests have connected to the Pocatello free clinic and VA. They have also had the opportunity to learn about nutritional support from the Eat Smart Idaho.

Policy and Training

The topic of policy and training holds less glamor than the structure of a building. With physical structures we see and feel outcomes in a way that is highly satisfying. However, a public building can be fraught with issues upon opening if the structure of the buildings use is not established in policies and procedures. Over the last several months we have assembled a policy committee from our board of directors that is establishing how we can best utilize the physical blessings we are receiving to reach the most people safely and effectively.



Our policies help us to develop procedures to run our facilities. As these procedures take form we are actively developing training. These trainings include ensuring physical safety of our staff, volunteers and guests. They also give our volunteers and staff skills like de-escalation, disease identification and appropriate relationship development with guests.

We are striving to be able to reopen our warming shelter this winter. In order for this to happen we are looking for qualified volunteers to help us run those 20-30 brutally cold nights to get folks off the street. Without the less glamorous work of policy writing, we would not be able to safely open our facilities to those that need our support.
