MODULE 1

HEALTHY CHURCH TRANSITIONS

Why It Matters

The way we join or leave a church reflects our understanding of what the church actually is. Scripture teaches us that the church isn't just an organization but the Body of Christ (1 Corinthians 12:27). Our approach to entering or exiting a church community should reflect this sacred understanding.

Joining a Church

1. Seek God's Guidance First
2. Examine the Church's Doctrine
3. Commit to the Body

Leaving a Church

1. Pray and Examine Your Motives
2. Communicate Openly with Leadership
3. Honor Your Commitments
4. Seek Reconciliation Where Needed
5. Leave with a Blessing
6. Avoid Division and Gossip

The way we join or leave a church reveals much about our understanding of Christian community. When done properly, even our departures can be testimonies to God's grace and the unity of believers across different congregations. As believers, we're called to represent Christ in all we do – including how we navigate these significant transitions in our spiritual journey.

BIBLICAL TRUTHS

The Bible is our all-sufficient rule for faith and practice. This Statement of Fundamental Truths is intended simply as a basis of fellowship among us (that we all speak the same thing,

The phraseology employed in this Statement is not inspired nor contended for, but the truth set forth is held to be essential to a full-gospel ministry. No claim is made that it covers all Biblical truth, only that it covers our need as to these fundamental doctrines.

The Assemblies of God has 16 Tenants of Faith or Biblical Truths that we abide by.

WHAT THIS MEANS:

1. We believe the Bible is the all-sufficient rule of faith and practice.
2. The purpose of Biblical truth is to maintain general unity.
3. Biblical truth is essential to a full gospel ministry_.
4. These Biblical truths do not cover all truth, the following ONLY cover fundamental doctrines (beliefs).

BIBLICAL TRUTHS

"We at NCA believe in the Triune God—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—and that the Bible is God's inspired and infallible Word; that Jesus Christ is God's eternal Son, fully divine and fully human, born of a virgin, who lived a sinless life, performed miracles, died as our substitute, rose bodily, and will return in glory; that humans are created in God's image but have fallen into sin, requiring divine redemption; that salvation comes only through Christ's shed blood by repentance and faith; that water baptism and Holy Communion are ordained by Christ for His Church; that all believers should seek the baptism in the Holy Spirit with the initial evidence of speaking in tongues; that sanctification comes through identification with Christ and submission to the Holy Spirit; that the Church is Christ's Body commissioned to evangelize the world, worship God, and build up believers; that divine healing is available through Christ's redemptive work; that Christ will return; that final judgment awaits the unrighteous; and that we anticipate new heavens and a new earth where righteousness dwells in fulfillment of God's promises."



PASTOR JOE

Pastor Joe Oby embraced his faith on resurrection Sunday, April 6, 1980. Since then, he has unwaveringly walked by faith, relying on God's guidance in every aspect of his life. Pastor Joe's commitment to serving others began when he took on his first role as a teacher at a daycare. Driven by his passion for making a positive impact, he eventually became the director of a before and after school program in Milwaukee's inner city.

At a young age of 21, Pastor Joe felt a divine calling to preach, leading him to embark on a path of ministry. He pursued his education at Rhema Bible Training Center in Tulsa, Oklahoma, and successfully graduated in 1991. Alongside his ministerial responsibilities, Pastor Joe served diligently in the Wisconsin State Legislature for a remarkable nineteen years, from 1992 to 2011. In 1998, he responded God's leading and became a credentialed minister with the Assemblies of God (AG). Pastor Joe's dedication to ministry extended beyond his pastoral duties, as he simultaneously pursued a second career for the majority of his time in the pastorate. Alongside his ministry, Pastor Joe also worked with the Wisconsin State Department of Administration (DOA) from 2014 to 2018, focusing on housing, and has been actively involved in equity and inclusion work with Dane County since 2018.

Pastor Joe currently serves as the Vice President of People United to Save Urban America (PUTSUA) and actively contributes to a multicultural committee for the Wisconsin-Northern Michigan District (WNMD). He is also a proud member of the National Black Fellowship of the Assemblies of God (NBFAG). Driven by his passion for continuous growth, Pastor Joe is currently pursuing courses at Oral Roberts University (ORU) to enhance his knowledge and skills for effective ministry.

During a five-year period, Pastor Joe had the privilege of caring for his father, who fought bravely against dementia. This experience ignited a renewed passion within Joe for life, faith, and purpose. His life has also been deeply enriched by enduring friendships that have spanned over three decades.

On August 24, 1991, Pastor Joe entered into a blessed union of marriage with the love of his life, Krystal. Throughout their journey together, they have been blessed with three accomplished sons, Isaiah, Immanuel, and Israel. Pastor Joe also cherishes his daughter-in-law, Alina, and is the proud grandfather of two grandchildren.

CULTURE VALUES

Our culture values define who we are as we do ministry.

The church is in the business of directing people to the God that will transform them from the inside out. These culture values are what each NCA member should represent wherever they go.

AUTHENTICITY

Honesty and authenticity is number one for us. We don't want anybody to feel like they need to change who they are to come into the church. We welcome everyone as they are-- flaws and all. Our hope is that the gospel will transform their heart, not that the church would transform their actions.

Matthew 23:26 (NLT): "You blind Pharisee! First wash the inside of the cup and the dish, and then the outside will become clean, too."

HUMILITY

No person within the body is without flaw. No message anybody ever preached (aside from Jesus) was perfect. Let's come to the table recognizing that we don't have it all figured out. Let's love people through their flaws, not condemn them for them. Let's submit ourselves before authority.

2 Corinthians 12:9 (NIV): "But he said to me, 'My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness.' Therefore I will boast all the more gladly about my weaknesses, so that Christ's power may rest on me."

CULTURE VALUES

HUNGER

We are not a church that is comfortable with our religion. We are never fully satisfied. We are a church that is hungry for God. Hungry for the lost to be saved. Hungry for more of Christ's character in our lives. Hungry for transformation in the world. We come to service hungry to learn more about who God is.

Psalms 63:1 (ESV): O God, you are my God; earnestly I seek you; my soul thirsts for you; my flesh faints for you, as in a dry and weary land where there is no water.

DEVOTION

We are a church that is committed to God and our service to Him. We commit ourselves to prayer, scripture, fellowship, and doing the work that God has called us to. Without Him, we can do nothing. God does not move if we are not devoted to Him.

John 15:5 (NIV): "I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing."

COMPASSION



A good steward does two simple things:

We are to be good stewards of our time, talents, spiritual gifts, and finances. We believe that tithing (giving 1/10 of one's personal income) is a recognition that everything we have comes from God. While we do not believe tithing to be a condition for salvation, we do believe it is a very important Biblical model of God's design for supporting the ministry and reaching the world with the Gospel.

Church fellowship plays a critical role in strengthening the spiritual journey of each individual within the congregation. MODULE 3

SPIRITUAL GIFTS

In this module, we explore the biblical concept of Spiritual Gifts and discover how God has uniquely equipped each believer for service within His church. Spiritual Gifts are special abilities given by the Holy Spirit to every Christian for the purpose of ministry, building up the Body of Christ, and glorifying God. Understanding and using your Spiritual Gifts is essential to experiencing fulfillment as a member of the Body of Christ and effectively serving in ways that align with God's purpose for your life. This foundational teaching will equip you to take your next steps in your faith journey.

WHAT ARE SPIRITUAL GIFTS?

Spiritual Gifts are special abilities given by the Holy Spirit to every believer. The term comes from the Greek word "charisma," meaning "a gift of grace." These gifts are not earned or deserved, but are graciously given to us for specific purposes. Scripture provides the foundation for our understanding of Spiritual Gifts in several passages, including Romans 12:6-8, 1 Corinthians 12:4-11, Ephesians 4:11-13, and 1 Peter 4:10-11. God gives these gifts to equip us for ministry, build up the Body of Christ, and ultimately bring glory to Himself.

KEY DISTINCTIONS

It's important to understand how Spiritual Gifts differ from other aspects of Christian life. While the Fruit of the Spirit (Galatians 5:22-23) relates to character traits all believers should develop, Spiritual Gifts are specific abilities for service. Similarly, natural talents may be present from birth and can be used by both believers and non-believers, while Spiritual Gifts are specifically empowered by the Holy Spirit for kingdom purposes. The key distinction often lies in their purpose—talents can serve many ends, but Spiritual Gifts are specifically designed to build Christ's church and glorify God.

SPIRITUAL GIFTS

1. **Administration:** organize, direct, and implement plans to lead others in the various ministries of the Church. It is closely related to the gift of leadership, but is more goal or task orientated.
2. **Apostleship:** plant new ministries and churches, go into places where the Gospel is not preached, reach across cultures to establish churches in challenging environments, raise up and develop leaders, call out and lead pastors and shepherds, and much more.
3. **Discernment:** able to clearly recognize and distinguish between the influence of God, Satan, the world, and the flesh in a given situation.
4. **Evangelism:** able to clearly and effectively communicate the Gospel of Jesus Christ to all types of people; burdened for the lost and able to overcome the normal fear of rejection.
5. **Exhortation:** able to strengthen and encourage those who are wavering in their faith; able to uplift and motivate others as well as challenge and rebuke them in order to foster spiritual growth and action.
6. **Faith:** has a trust and confidence in God that allows them to live boldly for Him and manifest that faith in mighty ways; expect God to move and are not surprised by answered prayer.
7. **Giving:** meets the various needs of others; loves to share with others, hospitable, and excellent stewards who often adjust their lifestyles in order to give more.
8. **Knowledge:** able to acquire unique insights into Scripture and relate it to all aspects of life for others.
9. **Leadership:** visionaries who are not typically concerned with details; entrepreneurial and willing to take risks to see the kingdom of God advanced through the church; will go to great lengths to protect those under their care; well-equipped to lead through crisis situations
10. **Mercy:** loves and assists those who are suffering; sensitive to the feelings and circumstances of others; quickly discerns when someone is not doing well; good listener and feels the need to "be there" for others.
11. **Pastor/Shepherd:** called and gifted to care for the spiritual well-being of a local body of God's people; readily available to others; cares deeply for the individual.
12. **Prophecy:** able to receive a divinely inspired message (exhortation, correction, disclosure, prediction, etc and deliver it to the church; however, it is to be tested by the church.
13. **Serving/Ministering:** desire to help by serving in the background while knowing that their contribution is displaying the love of Christ to the world; joyfully and willingly notice and meet needs.
14. **Teaching:** able to effectively communicate what the Bible says, what it means, and how to apply it to our lives; loves to study; loves and protects the truth.
15. **Wisdom:** able to not only impart truth and understanding to believers (knowledge), but to invoke a response that leads to transformed hearts and lives; able to see clearly in confusing situations; recognizes where decisions/actions may lead and can warn others.
16. **Hospitality:** The Gift of Hospitality is that special interest in opening one's home for food and fellowship, or to just provide a place to stay for someone in need.

THE CHURCH

MINISTRY STRUCTURE IN THE CHURCH

The church functions through two main areas of ministry. First are the "assigned offices"—leadership roles such as pastors, elders, and deacons established in Scripture (Acts 6:1-6, Philippians 1:1, 1 Timothy 3). These leaders must possess appropriate gifts for their roles. Second are the Spiritual Gifts distributed to all believers. Every Christian has at least one gift that enables them to fulfill specific functions in ministry. Together, these two areas work harmoniously to create a healthy, functioning church body where Christ's mission is advanced.

It's important to note that structuring a church this way is not the only biblical approach; some churches are led primarily by elders, or function through a community working together with different leadership models.

USING YOUR GIFTS

THE IMPORTANCE OF USING YOUR GIFTS

Scripture compares the church to a human body where each part has a vital role (1 Corinthians 12). When we don't use our gifts, we miss our purpose, the church is weakened, ministry opportunities are missed, and others miss out on blessings. Conversely, active use of our gifts leads to personal fulfillment, church growth, God's glorification, and blessing for others. God designed His church to function as an interdependent community where each member contributes according to their giftedness.

DISCOVERING YOUR SPIRITUAL GIFTS

Discovering your Spiritual Gifts involves a prayerful process. Begin by studying Scripture to understand the various gifts. Pray for guidance and wisdom as you seek to identify your gifts. Experiment with different ministry areas to see where you're most effective. Ask trusted believers what gifts they observe in you. Notice which service opportunities bring you fulfillment and produce fruit. Finally, consider taking a Spiritual Gifts assessment as another tool for discovery. Remember that this is a process that unfolds over time, often with confirmation from the community of believers around you.

WHAT'S NEXT?

At NCA, we offer various ministry opportunities aligned with specific gifts. Whether your gift is teaching, hospitality, leadership, or service, there's a place for you to contribute meaningfully. We provide resources for further study to help you grow in understanding and using your gifts. As a new partner, we encourage you to make a commitment to serve using your gifts, starting with one ministry area that aligns with your suspected gifts. Your involvement is essential to our church's health and mission.

SPIRITUAL GIFTS ASSESSMENT

The included Spiritual Gifts assessment is designed to help you identify areas where you may be gifted. Complete all questions honestly, based on your experiences and preferences rather than what you think you "should" answer. After completing the assessment, use the scoring guide to calculate your results. The gifts with the highest scores may indicate your areas of giftedness. Review the descriptions of these gifts and reflect on how they align with your experiences and interests. Remember that this assessment is just one tool—confirm these results through prayer, Scripture study, ministry experience, and feedback from others.


