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## DAY 2: LOVE LIKE JESUS

### Read 1 John 3:16

This week, we're learning about how to love others because Jesus loves us. One of the SUPER awesome things about Jesus is that He's not asking us to do something He wasn't willing to do Himself. Jesus died on the cross to pay the price for our sin—the stuff we do that's wrong—so that we could be forgiven. He didn't just "say" He loved us, He showed it!

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## DAY 3: IMPRESSION OF LOVE

### Read John 13:35

Gather the people in your family and some paper. Ask everyone to remove their shoes and quickly trace their footprints. Make sure you trace yours, too. When finished, cut them out and lay them out on the floor. Can you identify each person's footprints? Whose footprint is the biggest? Whose is the smallest?

When you walk through mud, or snow, or something wet, you leave a footprint behind. People know where you've been by the footprints you leave behind. Love works the same way. When you love others, it's like leaving a footprint behind that says, "\_\_\_\_\_ was here. We know she loves Jesus because of the way she loves the people around her."

When you leave a room, do you leave behind an impression of love? Do the people around you know that you are a Jesus follower by how you love God and love others?

**Look for opportunities to prove you are a Jesus follower by loving others.**

## DAY 4: A NEW COMMAND

## Read John 15:12–13

What is Jesus “commanding” us to do here? Write your answer on the line below.

If you want to build strong relationships with others, you have to love them like Jesus has loved you. Jesus gave His life for you. And because you are deeply loved, Jesus is asking you to share His love with the people around you.

When you want to be first, when you think something isn't fair, when you want to insist that your way is the best way, remember Jesus' command to love others as He loves you.

**You can love others because Jesus loves you.**

## DAY 5: EVERYTHING IN LOVE

## Read 1 Corinthians 16:14

What did you do today? Did you go to school? Ball or dance practice? Did you hang out with your friends at lunch or eat dinner with your family? Think about all the people you saw and interacted with over the course of your day.

No matter where you go, or what you do, as a follower of Jesus, you're called to "do everything in love." Even when others are hard to love. Even when it's the last thing you feel like doing. Even when it requires an extra amount of patience or time.

Love should always be your response. Why? Because YOU are loved. God's love for you isn't conditional. He loves you no matter what. And the good news is that God will help you love others, even when it's the last thing you feel like doing.

**“Heavenly Father, thank You for loving us no matter what. Will You help us choose to love others, even when it’s hard? We love You, God. Thank You for sending Jesus to prove how much You love us. Amen.”**
