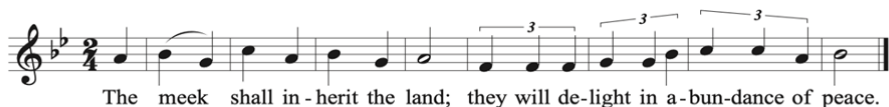

Sermon

The Rev. Hunter Jordan

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, visible and invisible.
