
Sources (Old Testament)

- "The law of the Lord is perfect, <u>reviving</u> the soul; the <u>testimony</u> of the Lord is sure, making wise the simple." (Psalm 19:7)


And when they had prayed, the place was shaken where they were assembled together; and they were all filled with the Holy Ghost, and they spake the word of God with boldness.





"Awakenings" Defined (McLoughlin)

- "Critical disjunctions in our self-understanding"
- "Profound cultural transformations," not brief outbursts
- "Confusing and tumultuous" but ultimately "positive and unifying"
- "Begin in periods of cultural disruption and grave personal stress.... [People] lose faith in the legitimacy of norms, the viability of institutions, and the authority of leaders of church and state."
- "Conversion of great numbers of people from an old to a new world view.... Awakening of a people caught in an outmoded, dysfunctional world view to the necessity of converting their mindset, their behavior, and their institutions to more relevant or more functionally useful ways of understanding and coping with changes in the world they live in."

How can we tell? (Charles G. Finney)

- "A revival is nothing else than a new beginning of obedience to God."
- "When the church finds its members falling into gross and scandalous sins, then it is time for the church to awake and cry to God for a revival of religion."
- "When there are dissensions and jealousies and evil speakings among professors of religion, then there is a great need of a revival. These things show that Christians have got far from God, and it is time to think earnestly of a revival."
- "A revival breaks the power of the world and of sin over Christians."
- "O Lod revive Thy work in the midst of the years, in the midst of the years make known; in wrath remember mercy" (Habakkuk 3:2)

Old Testament Prophets (Isaiah)

- "Castigating God's chosen for departing from the old ways, yet shedding new light on traditions
- "Look upon old truths from a new perspective, not a repudiation of old ways







• "We must be knit together, in this work, as one man. We must entertain each other in brotherly affection. We must be willing to abridge ourselves of our superfluities, for the supply of others' necessities. We must uphold a familiar commerce together in all meekness, gentleness, patience and liberality. We must delight in each other; make others' conditions our own; rejoice together, mourn together, labor and suffer together, always having before our eyes our commission and community in the work, as members of the same body. So shall we keep the unity of the spirit in the bond of peace. The Lord will be our God, and delight to dwell among us, as His own people, and will command a blessing upon us in all our ways, so that we shall see much more of His wisdom, power, goodness and truth, than formerly we have been acquainted with.... For we must consider that we shall be as a city upon a hill. The eyes of all people are upon us. So that if we shall deal falsely with our God in this work we have undertaken, and so cause Him to withdraw His present help from us, we shall be made a story and a by-word through the world. We shall opén the mouths of enemies to speak evil of the ways of God, and all professors for God's sake. We shall shame the faces of many of God's worthy servants, and cause their prayers to be turned into curses upon us till we be consumed out of the good land whither we are going.


"Jeremiad"



Jeremiah 2:2-5

"Go and cry in the ears of Jerusalem, saying, Thus saith the Lord; I remember thee, the kindness of thy youth, the love of thine espousals, when thou wentest after me in the wilderness, in a land that was not sown. Israel was holiness unto the Lord, and the firstfruits of his increase.... Thus saith the Lord, What iniquity have your fathers found in me, that they are gone far from me, and have walked after vanity, and are become vain?"

"Whether we have not in a great measure forgotten our Errand into the Wilderness. You have solemnly professed before God, Angels and Men, that the Cause of your leaving your Country, Kindred and Fathers houses and transporting your selves with your Wives, Little Ones and Substance over the vast Ocean into this waste and howling Wilderness, was your Liberty to walk in the Faith of the Gospel with all good Conscience according to the order of the Gospel, and your enjoyment of the pure Worship of God according to his Institution, without humane Mixtures and Impositions. Now let us sadly consider whether our ancient and primitive affections to the Lord Jesus, his glorious Gospel, his pure and Spiritual Worship and the Order of his House, rémain, abide and continue firm, constant, entire and inviolate. Our Saviour's reiteration of this Question, What went ye out into the Wilderness to see? is no idle repetition, but a sad conviction of our dullness and backwardness to this great duty.... Wherefore let us call to remembrance the former dayes, and consider whether it was not then better with us, than it is now.
