# Worth the Risk

## Following Jesus is Risky

Can you think back to the time you gave your life to Jesus Christ? What thoughts flooded your mind when you came up out of the water of baptism to walk as a new creation? If I had to guess, you were a bit risky back in those days. You probably shared your faith more openly with an urgency for others to come and meet Jesus. You probably took more risks.

## A Pattern of Risk

We can look throughout the Bible and see some incredible examples of normal people like you and I who took healthy risks for God. Abraham left all he knew behind. Esther approached the king without an invitation. Daniel prayed openly though it was illegal. Peter defied the laws of physics and walked on water. Stephen continued preaching the good news as the crowd picked up stones. Paul risked his stature and reputation on Jesus. Someone risked telling you about the truth in scripture.

## The Pattern Must Continue

So, if history has laid out an obvious example of risking everything on our Lord, Jesus, then it only makes sense for us to continue that pattern. One of the most concerning verses of scripture to me is found in Judges 2:10: "After them another generation rose up who did not know the Lord or the works He had done for Israel." I don't know the details of how the entire generation grew up and did not know who God was, but I suspect that someone didn't risk telling them about the LORD.

## People are Worth the Risk

Jesus didn't give up heaven and come to earth to die for our sins just for us to become complacent. He did it so that the whole world would have the opportunity to be restored back to God. Without Jesus, those around us will be eternally separated from God. It's a fact of scripture. But the adventure begins when you realize that you're up! It's my turn, and your turn to risk our comforts, our finances, our time, our reputations, and anything else that might hinder us. Who will you risk telling about your new life in Jesus Christ? I promise you, they are worth it.
