



What You Heard *In the Word*

- David wanted to build a house for the ark, but God sent him a message through the prophet Nathan that one of his sons would build it. God promised that David's throne would be established forever through a special descendant, who was the Savior, Jesus.

OutWord *For Family Discussion*

Suppose your friend says that the Old Testament characters aren't important. We only need to read about Jesus in the New Testament.

What could you say?

Jesus is the most important person in the Bible. He lived a perfect life, died on the cross for us, and rose from the grave to conquer death. But the Old Testament and the history it tells us is really important! Skipping the Old Testament is like skipping the first half of a storybook; you won't know the characters or the story line. In the Old Testament, God explained the problem of sin and showed his plan to send the Savior, Jesus. God promised men including Abraham, Jacob, Judah, and David that the Messiah, Jesus, would come from their family. The Old Testament gives prophecies about who Jesus would be and where he would be born! All these prophecies came true when Jesus came. God gave us the whole Bible for a reason, so we should read and study all of it.
