READING MODIFICATIONS



Thank you so much for leading our youngest kids at Impact Kids. We strongly believe no one is too young or old to learn from the Bible and grow as a disciple of Jesus. Because of this, we give all kid's groups the same content from which to work. We know not everyone learns at the same pace, so we are including some ways you can make this work best for your group.

Here are suggestions to make it work best:

- **READ** everything to your kids and model how to track the words with their fingers as you read.
- WRITE the words for the kids on separate index cards provided.
 When asked to highlight words or summarize the story, write it out for the kids while you are talking so they can see how to do it. Then take your time playing detective to match the words with the ones you wrote.
- **DRAW** a picture instead of writing words. Allow kids to draw pictures instead of writing words for the summary or prayers.
- MODEL by completing the activity in their book in your book. Let kids copy your work. They are learning by modeling.
- **PRIORITIZE** Bible Activity, Discussion and Praying. Faith comes from hearing the Word of God. Take time to focus on making sure kids hear you read the Bible. Feel free to cut out other activities.

Be Real, Not Fake

September 7, 2022

Scripture: Galatians 5:13-16; Galatians 5:22-23 **Story Point:** Don't fake it. Let God's Holy Spirit change you.

SOCIAL/FAMILY TABLE

Serve pizza, put names on water bottles, trash and clean up/wipe down tables and wash hands.

- Introduce yourself and welcome kids by name.
- Ask kids to share what happened during their day at school, home, etc.
- Ask kids to share something they are learning.
- Ask kids to share something they know about the Holy Spirit.
- For fun: Which fruit is your favorite?

SMALL GROUP

Read: Galatians 5:13-16; 5:22-23

Say: We are going to read the Bible Story from our Bible today first. Our story is in the Book of Galatians. Who can tell me where Galatians is in the Bible? (Show the table of contents and how to find where Galatians is. Talk about the Old Testament - before Jesus and the New Testament - Jesus' life and after his death and resurrection.) Which section of the Bible is Galatians in? (New Testament)

So, open your Bible halfway and then keep flipping toward the back. Look at the top of the page, Galatians is the eighth book in the New Testament. Now we need to look at the numbers. The big number in bold is the chapter so we need to find a big 5. The little numbers closer to the words are called verses, we are looking for 13-16. Did everyone find it? Help each other if you found it in your Bible. Now let's read it together. Who wants to read first? Read now:

13 You, my brothers and sisters, were called to be free. But do not use your freedom to indulge the flesh; rather, serve one another humbly in love. 14 For the entire law is fulfilled in keeping this one command: "Love your neighbor as yourself." 15 If you bite and devour each other, watch out or you will be destroyed by each other. 16 So I say, walk by the Spirit, and you will not gratify the desires of the flesh. GALATIANS 5:13-16

22 But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, 23 gentleness and self-control. Against such things there is no law. 24 Those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. 25 Since we live by the Spirit, let us keep in step with the Spirit.

GALATIANS 5:22-23

Say: Let's open your Impact Kids book and read the words to yourself again. I want you to get a highlighter and highlight these words as we read again: **spirit, flesh, fruit**. As we watch the video today I want you to count to see how many of these words are in the video too. (Pass out highlighters to each kid.)

Watch Bible Video: Roku/DVD

Say: Our story point today is: Don't fake it. Let God's Holy Spirit change you. Let's say that together: "Don't fake it. Let God's Holy Spirit change you." When you choose to follow Jesus, God's Holy Spirit grows the fruit of the Spirit in you.

When you follow Jesus, God is already helping you grow the fruit of the Spirit! The more you get to know Him the more it shows. Which fruit of the Spirit do you think would be hardest for you to grow? (Give time for most kids to answer this question.)

Let's go back to the words you highlighted today. spirit, flesh, and fruit. Looking at the Bible passage, what do you think each of these words means? Let's start with the easiest one, what is the fruit? (love, joy, peace, patience/forbearance, kindness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control.) When you think about those character qualities who shows you love the most? How about joy? Peace? Patience? Kindness? Faithfulness? Gentleness? Self Control? Why do you think it is important for us to picture what this looks like? Growing as a disciple means we are imitating our teachers. When we look at other people who believe in Jesus, we can use them as our teachers.

Now let's think about spirit and flesh. Would it help to consider these words as opposites? Anything that describes the flesh cannot describe the Spirit. The same thing is true for the Spirit. Anything that describes Spirit cannot describe the flesh. You could also call flesh, sin. God's Holy Spirit embodies all the fruit of the spirit and Jesus' character as well. The Holy Spirit is whom Jesus sent as our helper when He went to heaven. His spirit does not sin.

When you see words like this while reading your Bible it is a good idea to take some time to learn what they mean. There are lots of tools out there to help us figure it out. Bible Gateway.com or a Bible dictionary is a great place to start. By knowing the meaning of these words, we are finding ways to relate to what we are reading and not just reading words.

GALATIANS 5:16 says, "live by the Holy Spirit's power. then you will not do what your sinful nature wants you to do." Whose power helps you say no to temptation and sin- yours or the Holy Spirit? (The Holy Spirit's)

Discussion Questions:

- What do you think it means to act fake?
 Answers will vary. Ideas: Pretending to be someone you're not—trying to make people believe you're happy and good when you feel bad inside, etc.
- When you're trying really hard to be good all the time, how do you feel? Answers will vary.
- Talk about a time you acted good on the outside but you felt bad on the inside.
 Answers will vary
- How do you think you'll be able to tell that God is changing your heart on the inside? Answers will vary. Ideas: It might be easier to say no to sins and yes to living God's way, you might make more choices that show the fruit of the Spirit, etc.
- If you get tired of making good choices, what do you think can help you? Answers will vary. Ideas: Pray for God's help; talk to a trusted adult; etc.
- Which fruit of the Spirit will you ask God to help you get better at this week? Answers will vary. See word search for a list.

Pray:

- Ask kids to share things they'd like to pray about.

- Pray together over the prayer requests.

SMALL GROUP

Read: Acts 5:1-11

Say: We are going to read the Bible Story from our Bible today first. Our story is in the Book of Acts. Who can tell me where Acts is in the Bible? (Show the table of contents and how to find where Acts is. Talk about the Old Testament - before Jesus and the New Testament - Jesus' life and after his death and resurrection.) Which section of the Bible is Acts in? (New Testament)

So, open your Bible halfway and then keep flipping toward the back. Look at the top of the page, Acts is the fifth book in the New Testament. Now we need to look at the numbers. The big number in bold is the chapter so we need to find a big 5. The little numbers closer to the words are called verses, we are looking for 1-11. Did everyone find it? Help each other if you found it in your Bible. Now let's read it together. Who wants to read first? Read now:

- **1** A man named Ananias and his wife, Sapphira, also sold some land. **2** He kept part of the money for himself. Sapphira knew he had kept it. He brought the rest of it and put it down at the apostles' feet.
- **3** Then Peter said, "Ananias, why did you let Satan fill your heart? He made you lie to the Holy Spirit. You have kept some of the money you received for the land. **4** Didn't the land belong to you before it was sold? After it was sold, you could have used the money as you wished. What made you think of doing such a thing? You haven't lied just to people. You've also lied to God."
- **5** When Ananias heard this, he fell down and died. All who heard what had happened were filled with fear. **6** Some young men came and wrapped up his body. They carried him out and buried him.
- **7** About three hours later, the wife of Ananias came in. She didn't know what had happened. **8** Peter asked her, "Tell me. Is this the price you and Ananias sold the land for?" "Yes," she said. "That's the price."
- **9** Peter asked her, "How could you agree to test the Spirit of the Lord? Listen! You can hear the steps of the men who buried your husband. They are at the door. They will carry you out also."
- 10 At that moment she fell down at Peter's feet and died. Then the young men came in. They saw that Sapphira was dead. So they carried her out and buried her beside her husband. 11 The whole church and all who heard about these things were filled with fear.

ACTS 5:1-11

Say: Let's open your Impact Kids book and read the words to yourself again. I want you to draw a picture of Ananias and Sapphira and what happened to them in the story today. While we watch the video you can draw your picture. (Pass out pencils to each kid.)

Watch Bible Video: Roku/DVD

Say: Our story point today is: Tell the truth. Be honest in all you say and do. Let's say that together: "Tell the truth. Be honest in all you say and do." How do you think lying is like hiding a prize in a clear cup?

Proverbs 12:22 says: "The Lord detests lying lips, but he delights in those who tell the truth." The verse says God hates lying. What do you think He doesn't like about it?

Let's go back to the picture you drew during the video. Tell me about your pictures. Do you have room to draw more? Draw this: God looking at you when you lie and when you tell the truth. Does it matter where you are or who you are with? Does it matter if it is a small lie or a big lie? How does knowing this help us become a better disciple, an imitator of Jesus?

Discussion Questions:

- What do you think is so bad about lying? Answers will vary.
- What do you think it means to be honest?
 Answers will vary. Idea: being truthful in all you say and do.
- In the Bible story, two people died when they lied, but our bodies don't usually die when we lie. What do you think does die when we lie? Our reputation, the trust others have in us, etc.

- Once you tell lies, what do you think can help people trust you again? Ask God to help you stay honest; pray God helps others see that God's changed you; tell the truth; keep your promises; etc.
- Share the name of someone you've lied to and you need to apologize to. Answers will vary.
- Think of a lie you tell a lot. Tell your group what it is and ask them to pray God helps you quit telling that lie. Answers will vary

Pray:

- Ask kids to share things they'd like to pray about.
- Show them where they can write or draw prayer requests in their Impact Kids Book.

22 The crowd joined the attack against Paul and Silas. The judges ordered that Paul and Silas be stripped and beaten with rods. 23 They were whipped without mercy. Then they were thrown into prison. The jailer was commanded to guard them carefully. 24 When he received these orders, he put Paul and Silas deep inside the prison. He fastened their feet so they couldn't get away.

25 About midnight Paul and Silas were praying. They were also singing hymns to God. The other prisoners were listening to them.26 Suddenly there was a powerful earthquake. It shook the prison from top to bottom. All at once the prison doors flew open. Everyone's chains came loose.

27 The jailer woke up. He saw that the prison doors were open. He pulled out his sword and was going to kill himself. He thought the prisoners had escaped. 28 "Don't harm yourself!" Paul shouted. "We are all here!"

Our video today will help us this played out. Let's watch it while you write or draw. (Pass out pencils to kids)

Watch Bible Video: Roku/DVD

Say: Our story point today is I can be thankful when things are good- and when they're not. "Let's say that together: "I can be thankful when things are good and when they're not." Even when bad things happen, we still have a lot of reasons to thank God. What are you thankful for? When is it hard to be thankful? When is it easy to be thankful?

In **1 THESSALONIANS 5:18** it says: "Give thanks no matter what happens. God wants you to thank him because you believe in Christ Jesus." Who always has something to be thankful for? (everyone who believes in Jesus)

Let's go back to the summary we wrote/drew. Paul and Silas had many things to complain about for sure. How did they spend their time in jail? (praising God) What happened as a result? (God released them and allowed others to believe.) How does knowing this help us become better disciples, imitators of Jesus?

Discussion Questions:



(Show the table of contents and how to find where Ruth is. Talk about the Old Testament - before Jesus and the New Testament - Jesus' life and after his death and resurrection.) Which section of the Bible is Ruth in? (Old Testament)

So, open your Bible from the beginning. Look at the top of the page, Ruth is the eighth book in the Old Testament. Now we need to look at the numbers. The big number in bold is the chapter so we need to find a big 1. The little numbers closer to the words are called verses, we are looking for 8-10, 16-18. Did everyone find it? Help each other if you found it in your Bible. Now let's read it together. Who wants to read first? Read now:

8 Naomi said to her two daughters-in-law, "Both of you go back. Each of you go to your own mother's home. You were kind to your husbands, who have died. You have also been kind to me. So may the Lord be just as kind to you. 9 May the Lord help each of you find rest in the home of another husband." Then she kissed them goodbye. They broke down and wept loudly. 10 They said to her, "We'll go back to your people with you."

RUTH 1:8-10

Let's go back to the story about Ruth and our memory verse this week. What do good brothers, sisters, and friends do? (Stay loyal and help when you need it.) What do we get wrong when it comes to loyalty? Who do you think is the most loyal in our small group? How does knowing this help us become better disciples, imitators of Jesus?

Discussion Questions:

 What does it mean to be loyal? Be honest, be kind, and be there for your friends no matter what.

- Give some examples of ways to be loyal to your friends. Be there for them even when it's not fun; keep promises; stand up for them; help them; etc.
- What kind of actions aren't loyal? Saying someone isn't your friend anymore, breaking promises, gossiping about your friends, etc.



19 Then Jesus walked a little farther. As he did, he saw James, the son of Zebedee, and his brother John. They were in a boat preparing their nets. 20 Right away he called out to them. They left their father Zebedee in the boat with the hired men. Then they followed Jesus

MARK 1:19-20

Say: Let's open your Impact Kids book and read the words to yourself again. I want you to draw a picture of Jesus coming to James and his brother and asks them to follow him. If you need help finding a way to draw that picture watch the video and see if you can copy something there. Let's watch it now. (Pass out pencils to kids)

Watch Bible Video: Roku/DVD

Say: The next few weeks we are looking in the Bible to see what God says about us, or our ID because of Jesus. Today we are looking at love. Our story point today is: I am loved because God loves me! "Let's say that together: "I am loved because God loves me." In our story today Jesus called two disciples to follow him. How does Jesus show James and his brother he loves them? God loves us, but He hates sin and wrong choices. When we believe in Jesus, God doesn't see us for our sins anymore. Jesus covers that.

In **ROMANS 5:8** it says, "But here is how God has shown his love for us. While we were still sinners, Christ died for us." What must you do for God to love you? (absolutely nothing) Why do you think Jesus Christ died on the cross before we believed in Him?

There are times that all of us feel unloved. I'm sorry you feel like that. During those times, I try to remember the verse in Romans. Even when I didn't know anything about Jesus or God, God loved me. That means nothing takes His love away from us. Does that give anyone more comfort?

Let's go back to the story about James and his brother. James and his brother knew that following Jesus was worth leaving everything they knew. Even fishing. When we focus on God's love for us, it should get easier to do hard things. Even if it isn't easy, God's love for us does not change. How does knowing this help us become better disciples, imitators of Jesus?



44 Philip was from the town of Bethsaida. So were Andrew and Peter. **45** Philip found Nathanael and told him, "We have found the one whom Moses wrote about in the Law. The prophets also wrote about him. He is Jesus of Nazareth, the son of Joseph."

46 "Nazareth! Can anything good come from there?" Nathanael asked.

"Come and see," said Philip.

47 Jesus saw Nathanael approaching. Here is what Jesus said about him. "He is a true Israelite. Nothing about him is false."

48 "How do you know me?" Nathanael asked. Jesus answered, "I saw you while you were still under the fig tree. I saw you there before Philip called you."



Let's look back at the words you highlighted today. Do you know why we highlight words sometimes? So we can figure out what they mean and find ways to relate to what we are reading in our Bibles. Today you highlighted sinner, follow and Jesus. We can start with the easy one, Jesus. Who is Jesus? (our Savior, God's perfect Son who came to earth to take the weight of sins on the cross so we can have relationship with God forever, etc.) Now sinners, who are sinners? (everyone) Do you really think everyone sins? It matters. If you are struggling with that I want to pray with you that God would reveal this truth to you from the Bible. Last word follow, what did Jesus mean when He said follow? He meant leave everything behind and literally follow me and spiritually follow me. When you follow people, do you take it so seriously?



Which section of the Bible is Matthew in? (New Testament)

So, open your Bible halfway and then keep flipping toward the back. Look at the top of the page, Matthew is the first book in the New Testament. Now we need to look at the numbers. The big number in bold is the chapter so we need to find a big 17. The little numbers closer to the words are called verses, we are looking for 24-27. Did everyone find it? Help each other if you found it in your Bible. Now let's read it together. Who wants to read first? Read now:

24 Jesus and his disciples arrived in Capernaum. There the people who collect the temple tax came to Peter. They asked him, "Doesn't your teacher pay the temple tax?" **25** "Yes, he does," he replied.

When Peter came into the house, Jesus spoke first. "What do you think, Simon?" he asked. "Who do the kings of the earth collect taxes and fees from? Do they collect them from their own children or from others?"

26 "From others," Peter answered.
"Then the children don't have to pay," Jesus said to him. 27 "But we don't want to make them angry. So go to the lake and throw out your fishing line. Take the first fish you catch. Open its mouth. There you will find the exact coin you need. Take it and give it to them for my tax and yours." MATTHEW 17:24-27

19 My God will meet all your needs. He will meet them in keeping with his wonderful riches. These riches come to you because you belong to Christ Jesus. **PHILIPPIANS 4:19**

Say: Let's open your Impact Kids book and read the words to yourself again. While we watch the video today, I want you to draw a picture of our Bible story today. This one should be fun, money in a fish's mouth. WOW! Let's watch it now. (Pass out pencils to kids)

(Everything we need) There is a big difference there. Sometimes we will not be a "rich person" but we will have what we need so that God gets the glory. How does knowing this help us become better disciples, imitators of Jesus?

The big number in bold is the chapter so we need to find a big 4. The little numbers closer to the words are called verses, we are looking for 7-16. Did everyone find it? Help each other if you found it in your Bible. Now let's read it together. Who wants to read first? Read now:

7 Mordecai told him everything that had happened to him. He told him about the exact amount of money Haman had promised to add to the royal treasures. He said Haman wanted it to be used to pay some men to destroy the Jews. 8 Mordecai also gave Hathak a copy of the order. It commanded people to wipe out the Jews. The order had been sent from Susa. Mordecai told Hathak to show the order to Esther. He wanted Hathak to explain it to her. Mordecai told him to tell her to go and beg the king for mercy. Mordecai wanted her to make an appeal to the king for her people.

9 Hathak went back and reported to Esther what Mordecai had said. 10 Then Esther directed him to give an answer to Mordecai. She told him to say, 11 "There is a certain law that everyone knows about. All the king's officials know about it. The people in the royal territories know about it. It applies to any man or woman who approaches the king in the inner courtyard without being sent for. It says they must be put to death. But there is a way out. Suppose the king reaches out his gold scepter toward them. Then their lives will be spared. But 30 days have gone by since the king sent for me."

12 Esther's words were reported to Mordecai.

13 Then he sent back an answer. He said, "You live in the king's palace. But don't think that just because you are there you will be the only Jew who will escape. 14 What if you don't say anything at this time? Then help for the Jews will come from another place. But you and your family will die. Who knows? It's possible that you became queen for a time just like this."



32 David said to Saul, "Don't let anyone lose hope because of that Philistine. I'll go out and fight him."

33 Saul replied, "You aren't able to go out there and fight that Philistine. You are too young. He's been a warrior ever since he was a boy."

34 But David said to Saul, "I've been taking care of my father's sheep. Sometimes a lion or a bear would come and carry off a sheep from the flock. 35 Then I would go after it and hit it. I would save the sheep it was carrying in its mouth. If it turned around to attack me, I would grab its hair. I would strike it down and kill it. 36 In fact, I've killed both a lion and a bear. I'll do the same thing to this Philistine. He isn't even circumcised. He has dared the armies of the living God to fight him. 37 The Lord saved me from the paw of the lion. 



So, open your Bible at the beginning. Look at the top of the page, 1st Kings is the 11th book in the Old Testament. It is after Samuel. Now we need to look at the numbers. The big number in bold is the chapter so we need to find a big 18. The little numbers closer to the words are called verses, we are looking for 30-39. Did everyone find it? Help each other if you found it in your Bible. Now let's read it together. Who wants to read first? Read now:

30 Then Elijah said to all the people, "Come here to me." So they went to him. He rebuilt the altar of the Lord. It had been torn down. 31 Elijah got 12 stones. There was one for each tribe in the family line of Jacob. The Lord's message had come to Jacob. It had said, "Your name will be Israel." 32 Elijah used the stones to build an altar to honor the Lord. He dug a ditch around it. The ditch was large enough to hold 24 pounds of seeds. 33 He arranged the wood for the fire. He cut the bull into pieces. He placed the pieces on the wood. Then he said to some of the people, "Fill four large jars with water. Pour it on the offering and the wood." So they did. **34** "Do it again," he said. So they did it again. "Do it a third time," he ordered. And they did it the third time. 35 The water ran down around the altar. It even filled the ditch. **36** When it was time to offer the evening sacrifice, the prophet Elijah stepped forward. He prayed, "Lord, you are the God of Abraham, Isaac and Israel. Say: Let's open your Impact Kids book and read the words to yourself again. While we watch the video today, you are going to highlight these words: altar, again, prayed, answer, Lord. See if you hear these words in the video too? How many times? Let's watch it now. (Pass out highlighters to kids)

Watch Bible Video: Roku/DVD

Say: Elijah was a godly person who prayed powerful prayers! Elijah prayed for God to send him food, and God answered by sending ravens to feed him. What else did Elijah pray for? (to keep it from raining, rain, for God to show His power, etc.) Why do you think it showed courage when Elijah prayed powerful prayers?

Our story point today is: God gives me the courage to pray with power. "Let's say that together: "God gives me the courage to pray with power." When you pray, it shows courage.

Let's look back at the words you highlighted today: altar, again, prayed, answer, Lord. Let's start with Lord. Who is Lord? (Jesus-God) Now let's look at altar. (Look up http://www.mostholyplace.com/book-01 chapter-17.html to see a picture of what the altar could look like) Why do you think Elijah asked the people to put water on the altar many times? (God was about to do something big and he wanted the people to know it was God) Looking at prayed and answer. The thing to realize here is that Elijah expected God to answer and asked him to answer right now. The words we read in our Bibles have real meaning and help us understand why it is important to keep reading. God's Word is true and useful for teaching and correcting all of us.

In JAMES 5:16 it says, "The prayer of a godly person is powerful. It makes things happen." Whose prayers are powerful? (Godly people). How does knowing this help us become better disciples, imitators of Jesus?

Discussion Questions:

- How does praying show courage? It shows we trust God no matter what's going on.
- What takes more courage for you: praying every day or praying in front of others? Answers will vary.
- What do you think is the difference between selfish prayers and powerful prayers? Answers will vary.
- God might answer prayers differently than expected. If that happens, what do you think will give you courage to keep praying? Answers will vary.
- What can you do to find out what God's promises are? Look in the Bible.
- What prayer do you need to pray this week? Answers will vary.
- What will help you step up and pray powerfully this week? Answers will vary

Pray:

- Ask kids to share things they'd like to pray about.
- Show them where they can write or draw prayer requests in their Impact Kids Book.
 Write them down in your leader guide as well.
- Pray together over the prayer requests.

Scripture: 1 Corinthians 9:24-27; Mark 8:34

Story Point: God gives me the courage to live for Jesus.

SOCIAL/FAMILY TABLE

Serve pizza, put names on water bottles, trash and clean up/wipe down tables and wash hands.

- Introduce yourself and welcome kids by name.
- Ask kids to share what happened during their day at school, home, etc.
- Ask kids to share something they are learning.
- For fun: What is the best prize you can think of?

SMALL GROUP

Read: 1 Corinthians 9:24-27; Mark 8:34

Say: We are going to read the Bible Story from our Bible today first. Our story is in the Book of 1 Corinthians. Who can tell me where Corinthians is in the Bible? (Show the table of contents and how to find where 1 Corinthians is. Talk about the Old Testament - before Jesus and the New Testament - Jesus' life and after his death and resurrection.) Which section of the Bible is 1 Corinthians in? (New Testament)

So, open your Bible to the middle of the book and keep turning to the back. Look at the top of the page, 1st Corinthians is the 7th book in the New Testament. It is after Romans. Now we need to look at the numbers. The big number in bold is the chapter so we need to find a big 9. The little numbers closer to the words are called verses, we are looking for 24-27. Did everyone find it? Help each other if you found it in your Bible. Now let's read it together. Who wants to read first? Read now:

24 In a race all the runners run. But only one gets the prize. You know that, don't you? So run in a way that will get you the prize. 25 All who take part in the games train hard. They do it to get a crown that will not last. But we do it to get a crown that will last forever. 26 So I do not run like someone who doesn't run toward the finish line. I do not fight like a boxer who hits nothing but air. 27 No, I train my body and bring it under control. Then after I have preached to others, I myself will not break the rules. If I did break them, I would fail to win the prize.

1 CORINTHIANS 9:24-27

You Must Pick Up Your Cross

34 Jesus called the crowd to him along with his disciples. He said, "Whoever wants to be my disciple must say no to themselves. They must pick up their cross and follow me.

MARK 8:34

Say: Let's open your Impact Kids book and read the words to yourself again. While we watch the video today, I want you to write or draw a picture, to sum up, what we read. What do you think we could say about what Paul is writing in Corinthians? How about: Only one person wins a prize in a race. In the race to heaven, our goal is to share Jesus with everyone so they can join us in heaven. We can do this with our words and how we live. Write or draw those things while we watch our video. Let's watch it now. (Pass out highlighters to kids)

Watch Bible Video: Roku/DVD

Say: What did you say was the best prize you could think of? Did that change after you heard our Bible story today? Courage lives for Jesus, but sometimes it's hard because we have to give up things we're used to. Doing exercise when our bodies are tired makes our bodies stronger, but training to run the race for Jesus is different. It makes us stronger to give up our old, selfish ways.

Our story point today is: God gives me the courage to live for Jesus. "Let's say that together: "God gives me the courage to live for Jesus" What does training to run the race for Jesus do? (It makes us stronger to give up our old selfish ways.)

In MARK 8:34 it says, "If any of you wants to be my follower, you must turn from your selfish ways, take up your cross, and follow me" Take out your index card and write all the words in Mark 8:34 down so you can take it home to practice. Who said this in the Bible? (Jesus). You don't have to carry a cross, but Jesus telling us to think about Him on the cross in everything we do. Thinking about this and His love and promises helps us refocus and change from the inside out. How does knowing this help us become better disciples, imitators of Jesus?

Discussion Questions:

- What is a sacrifice? Giving up something we love for something we love even more
- What things distract you from doing what God wants you to do? Answers will vary.
- What makes it difficult for you to live 100 percent for Jesus every day? Answers will vary.
- When does it take courage to live for Jesus? When you have to give up things you like or things you're used to; when others make fun of you, etc.
- What prize can we think about when it's hard to give up our selfish ways? Pleasing Jesus, living for Jesus, loving Jesus, etc.
- What selfish ways do you need to give up this week to follow Jesus better? Answers will vary.
- Giving up selfish ways isn't easy or comfortable. What can you do this week to have the courage to give them up? Answers will vary.

Pray:

- Ask kids to share things they'd like to pray about.
- Show them where they can write or draw prayer requests in their Impact Kids Book.
 Write them down in your leader guide as well.
- Pray together over the prayer requests.




