SOCIAL TIME

The first 10-15 minutes as kid's arrive are some of our most important times to meet needs and show kids they are valued. This is why we provide strategic activities for you help engage with every kid as they arrive.

- This month you have Hot Potato and Memory Game or Scavenger Hunt.
- You will also find 2 Social activities each week. **Use one now and one at the end to redirect attention.

Games and Music (10 minutes)

What You Need: Social Game Instruction Page including Roku Games, microphone (1 per group), Music and music player (1 per group)

What You Do:

- Play worship songs and other songs available on Roku during the Social Game or while kids are playing.
- Using the supplies and game instruction page, choose one game to play with the kids today.
- As you are playing, use this as a time to call each kid by name and learn their names well.

Say: That was a fun game to get us ready to watch our Bible video. Let's sit and listen to our story today."

Bible Story - Say This!

Thanks, Super Crew! I knew they could help us connect our Super Clue to the Big Deal. In our Bible story, do you remember how Thomas was feeling a little unsure? His heart was wondering if the man in front of him was actually Jesus, the Son of God. God knew that Thomas was doubting, and God knew what was inside Thomas' heart. Today's Super Clue is a feelings chart. A feelings chart can help us understand what we are feeling on the inside. It can help us know if we are happy, sad, excited, or even mad. If we are happy or we are hurting, God cares for us.

Great job! Let's pray and thank God for helping us obey Him. When we pray, we talk and listen to God.

God, thank You so much for knowing our hearts and loving us. Thank You for helping us when we ask. We love You! Amen.

Can you say the Big Deal with me?

Press Pause! (*Hold both hands out with palms out.*)

God Cares When I Hurt! (*Give yourself a hug.*)

Bible Story Video (10 minutes)

Feelings Chart(20 minutes)

Preschoolers will create their own feelings charts by matching the emotions.

Supplies: "Feelings Chart" printable (1 per child), Crayons (several), Glue sticks (1 per child), Scissors (1 per group; adult-use only)

Craft Instructions:

1. Before the session, print "Feelings Chart" printables, one per child. Cut out the face circles for each feeling, one set per child.
2. Give each preschooler a feelings chart, a set of face circles, crayons, and a glue stick.
3. Invite them to glue each face to the circles on the feelings chart.
4. Encourage preschoolers to color their feelings charts.

What To Do: Our Super Clue today is a feelings chart. What is our Super Clue? (*A feelings chart!*) Feelings charts can help you name what you are feeling. You can name when you feel happy, excited, and silly. You can also name when you feel sad, upset, or have doubts. We are going to make our own feelings charts. Each of you will get a feelings chart that looks like this. (*Display "Feelings Chart" printable.*) I want you to glue each of the faces with feelings on them to the circles on your feelings chart. When you finish you can color your feelings chart.

Keep It Going: Use your feelings chart to retell today's Bible story. Remind preschoolers how Thomas felt when he doubted that Jesus was alive again and how Jesus cared for him and knew Thomas was doubting.

Leader Tip: Explain the craft before you pass out supplies. It is easier to keep their attention when there isn't a craft in front of them.

Loud And Clear: Great job on your feelings charts! A feelings chart is a great way to name what you are feeling. You can name when you feel happy, excited, and silly. You can also name when you feel sad, upset, or have doubts. In our Bible story today, Jesus knew what was going on inside Thomas' heart, and He knows what is going on inside our hearts too. He knows when we doubt and when we make wrong choices. God knows how we are feeling, but He loves us no matter what. He wants us to believe and follow Him.

Say:

- Who remembers what our Super Clue is today? (*a feelings chart*)
- What does a feelings chart help us remember? (*A feelings chart helps you name what you are feeling. God cares when we hurt, and He knows our heart and how we are feeling.*)
- What was Thomas feeling in his heart? (*Thomas was doubting that Jesus was alive.*)
- **God knows my heart.** What does it mean that God knows your heart? (*God knows what is going on inside us, like when we doubt or even when we make wrong choices, but He still loves and wants us to believe and follow Him.*)
- What did you learn about God today?

Our Big Deal is, Press Pause! God cares when I hurt!

Press Pause! (*Hold both hands out with palms out.*)

God Cares When I Hurt! (*Give yourself a hug.*)

In our Bible story today, we learned that Thomas was doubting that Jesus was truly who He said He was. God knew Thomas was doubting because He knows us. God loves us so much, and He always knows our hearts. He knows when our hearts are sad and when they are happy. When our hearts are sad or mad, we can press pause and ask God for help. He cares for us when we hurt.

Prepare kids to talk with their family about what they learned today.

- Pass out coloring pages for kids to take home.
- As family members arrive to pick up their kid, greet them and tell them one thing you noticed about their kid that day or something you talked to each kid about remembering this week.
- If there is time to chat with the family, ask how you can pray for them this week.
- Say bye to the kids and call them by name.
