SOCIAL TIME

The first 10 minutes as kids arrive is a very important time in your small group. Because of this, we provide you with intentional activities to engage their interests and help lead into a great discussion. All of this is so that “boredom” is not an excuse. Everything is only available one time.

Every week you have:

- Roku Games to play together that are changed out monthly.
- 2 month specific games or group activities.
- Plus 2 Social Activities. *** Use one now and save the other for an incentive to participate in all the activities.*

Games and Music (10 minutes)

What You Need: Instruction Page, Game Sets, Roku Game Instruction Page, Find the Difference Game on Roku, Theme Verse Poster

What You Do:

- Play worship songs and other songs available on Roku during the Social Game or while kids are playing.
- Using the supplies and game instruction page, choose one game to play with the kids today.
- As you are playing, use this as a time to call each kid by name and learn their names well.

Say: That was a fun game to get us ready to watch our Bible video. Let’s sit and listen to our story today.”

Bible Story Video (10 minutes)

Bible Story Recap- Say This

Isaiah saw God high and lifted up, sitting on a throne as the King. He saw heavenly creatures flying around God's throne and calling out about God's holiness. Isaiah realized that God is holy, meaning He is unique, perfect, and good. Everyone, say, "God is holy!" (God is holy!) When Isaiah recognized God's holiness, he did not feel worthy to be in God's presence. Isaiah recognized that he was not holy and thought he would be ruined, because God is so holy and He cannot be around sin.

But it was an exciting thing for Isaiah to know that God is holy and to know that God wanted Isaiah not just to know and love Him, but that He had something special in store for Isaiah. God cleansed Isaiah's sin and invited Isaiah to trust and follow Him. We can also know that God is holy and that He has something special in store for us!

Gospel Connection: (refer to the 4 Circles poster in your small group spaces)

(Circle 1) God has always been holy, unique, and separate from what He created. Even though He is holy and separate, He created people to know Him and to have a relationship with Him. The first two people God created, Adam and Eve, did not have any fear or shame when they were in God's presence. They knew God and had a perfect relationship with Him.

(Circle 2) Adam and Eve's perfect friendship with God didn't last, because sin came into the world and changed everything. Sin is choosing our own way instead of God's, and it separates us from God in a way we can't fix by ourselves

(Circle 3) God is holy and special, and He made a way for Isaiah—and for us—to be close to Him again. He sent His Son Jesus to take the punishment for our sin, and when Jesus rose again, He made a way for everyone who trusts Him to have life forever.

(Circle 4) When we repent from our sins, which means we admit our sins and turn away from them, and trust in Jesus, God says we are special and different too. We are His holy people—set apart to point people to Him, like Isaiah did. We are meant to know God, and we can know God is holy. God wants us to be holy like He is holy.

What makes someone really special? It is not the things we do or even what other people think about us. We can know that God is special and one of a kind, and He made us in His image. We can know that God is holy, and He calls us to be holy like Him. When we trust in Jesus, He helps us be like Him. That means He helps us do what is right and good. That is what makes us really special! Those are some really great things to know. Everyone, say, "I am meant to know God!" (*I am meant to know God!*)

God, You are holy. We thank You because You made the way for all of us to know You, even though we all sin. Thank You for forgiving us for our sins when we trust in Jesus. Thank You for giving us life forever when we trust in Jesus. We love you, God. Amen.

That is Separate

Kids will verbally lead blindfolded teammates to collect specific items in the room.

Big Goal: Know that **God is holy**, meaning He is special, one of a kind, separate, perfect, and good.

Leader Prep: Place five items (such as hula hoops, pool noodles, pit balls, playground balls) of four different colors (four red, four blue, four green, and so forth) throughout the room.

Supplies: Items in four colors (hula hoops, pool noodles, playground balls, and so forth) (20 per group), Blindfolds (2 per group), Timer or stopwatch (1 per group; optional)

What To Do: Everyone, say, "That Is Separate!" (*That Is Separate!*) In this game, you and a teammate are going to look for certain color items and separate them from the other objects in the room. It sounds easy, but there is a catch. Say, "Ooo, a catch!" (*Ooo, a catch!*) The player collecting the objects will be blindfolded! Your teammate will give you verbal directions to an object. You will pick up the item and take it to your teammate, then go out to collect the next one. Two teams will play at the same time, one team collecting one color item while the second team collects the other color item. We will see which team can collect all five of their items first. When you are blindfolded, move slowly with your arms outstretched so you do not hurt the other player or yourself. Everyone, say, "Let's play!" (*Let's play!*)

(Provide blindfolds for the first two teams and assign them colors to find once the blindfolds are on. Play multiple rounds, allowing all kids to play as the blindfolded player and the direction giver.)

Keep It Going: Challenge teams to gather the same color (rather than each team gathering different colors), seeing which team can get the most items.

Safety Tip: Monitor that blindfolded players are moving slowly and carefully.

Leader Tip: Smaller Group Option: Challenge one team to play at a time, timing the teams to see who can find the items the fastest.

Loud And Clear: You did an amazing job separating the items! Was it hard to identify which items needed to be separated? (*Allow kids to answer.*) It would have been easier to reach down and grab anything, but you needed to find and separate something special and unique. When we know God, we know He is Someone separate, special, and unique. He isn't like anyone or anything else. We can recognize that **God is holy**; we see how He is unique, one of a kind, and separate from anything or anyone else in this world. Say, "**God is holy!**" (*God is holy!*)

Let's chat about this more by looking at some questions that make us think deeper.

Discussion Questions:

- How do you stay plugged in and connected so you know what is going on with your friends and family? *(Allow kids to answer and share your own answer.)*
- How does a library card's barcode make the card unique and different from all other library cards? How is God unique and different from anyone or anything else? *(Allow kids to answer. Point out that **God is holy** and perfect, not like anyone or anything He created.)*
- The Bible tells us that we are meant to know God, and we can know that **God is holy**, which means He is separate, perfect, and good. Let's open our Bibles to **Isaiah 6:3** and read about it together. *(Invite kids to open their Bibles. Read the verse aloud or invite a kid who volunteers to read the verse aloud. Be sure to have Bibles available for kids who need one. Help kids find the verse so everyone can follow along together.)* Isaiah saw the heavenly creatures praising and celebrating God by calling out His holiness and saying that His glory fills the whole earth. How can you celebrate God in your life? *(Allow kids to answer and share your answer.)*
- Isaiah knew that He did not deserve to be in God's presence because of God's holiness, but God made a way for Isaiah to know Him and follow Him. How does God make the way for all of us to know Him and follow Him? *(Allow kids to answer. Point out that God sent Jesus, His only Son, to take our sins away. Remind kids that we can all know God and follow Him by trusting in Jesus.)*
- The Bible tells us that we are meant to know God, like Isaiah was meant to know God when God spoke to him. Isaiah was plugged in to God when God spoke to Him, and we all become plugged in to God when we trust in Jesus. What is something you learned today?

Is there anything you have questions about? *(Allow kids to answer, and share your own answer.)* Let's pray and talk to God. *(Lead the group in prayer. Consider using the following prayer prompt.)*

God, thank You for being holy. Thank You for being perfect, unique, and separate from all You have created. You are holy, and You made the way for all of us to know You. Thank You, God, for sending Jesus to make the way for all of us to know You. Help us to know You more. Amen.

When Isaiah recognized that God is holy, God made a way for Isaiah to know and follow Him. We can also know that God is holy, and He makes the way for us to know Him through Jesus.

GOING HOME

Pass out the coloring pages for kids to take home. Greet families as they arrive and tell them something about their child you saw today. Say goodbye and call everyone by name.
