

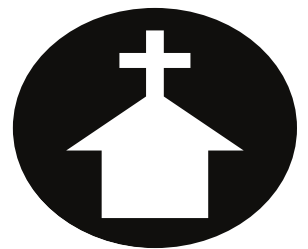

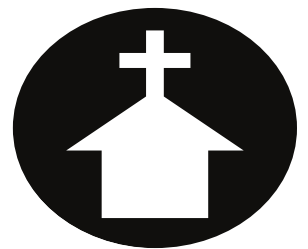

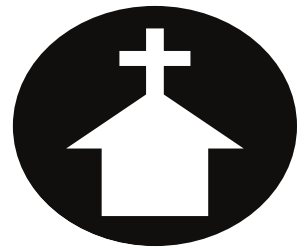
General Principle

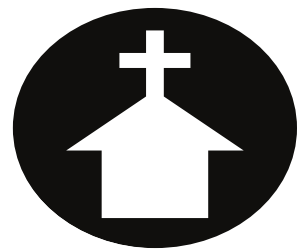

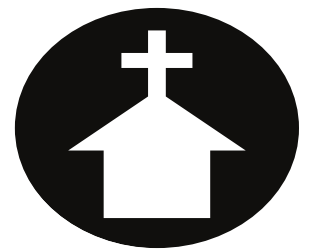
Corrective Discipline

Corrective Church Discipline

The body acting together intentionally to bring reproof and correction to a specific person for a particular sin to lead him to be more like Christ.

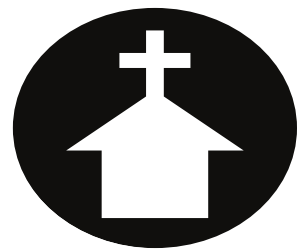


Four Phases in Church Discipline



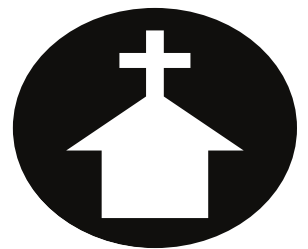
Key Thought

Progressive process not a
precise prescription



Key Goal

Keep the people involved as narrow as possible.



Phase 1

Private Conversation

Matt 18:15



Phase 2

Private Confirmation

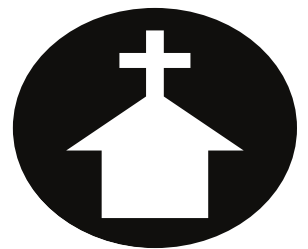

Key Principle

Clear confirmation must occur before a decision is made to move to congregational discipline.



Phase 3

Congregational Explanation

Matt 18:17a



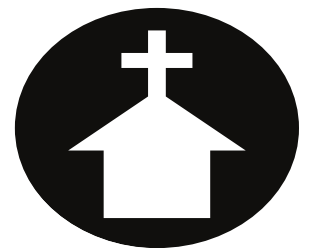
Deciding to move to Congregational Church Discipline



Key Principle

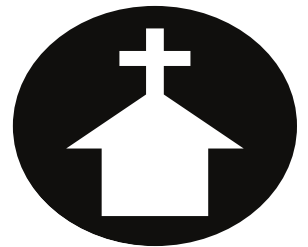
Deciding if a sin requires

(It is **not** a simple checklist.)



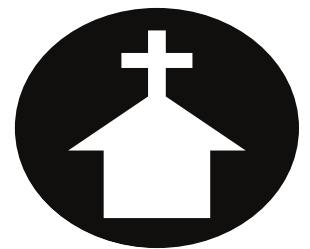
Key Principle

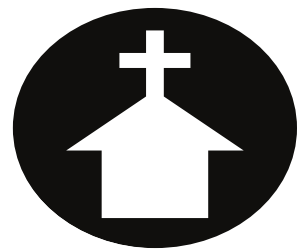

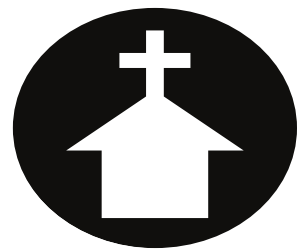
