Social Ministry Emphasis for February is Hilltop House <https://www.hilltophouse.org>
and **Refugee Family Support Fund**.



February's emphasis is to provide monetary and volunteer support for **Hilltop House**, **Hilltop Food Pantry**, and CLC's/Valpo's **Refugee Family Support Fund**. HH is located "on a hill" in a neighborhood west of Valparaiso U. where social service needs are real for the families and children living there. HH can provide as a health care provider Medicare and Hoosier

Healthwise benefits to those in Porter County living below the poverty level (estimated to be 9000 children and 4000 women in Porter County). A gift of \$50 permits Hilltop to provide childcare, health care, and community improvement activities within a child's own family setting (also contributions may qualify for Indiana's Neighborhood Assistance Tax Credit).

2025 Giving Statements

THANK YOU for supporting the ministries of Christ Lutheran Church! Your commitment to our congregation and our community shares the love of Christ with our neighbors here in Valparaiso and all over the world. **Our congregation does so much more than Sunday worship!** During the past few months, Christ Lutheran:

- Hosted a Lutheran World Relief in-gathering, where we gathered an actual truckload of school supplies, personal care kits, baby care kits, fabric kits, and quilts from congregations all over the region;
- Raised \$4,955 at our annual Silent Auction, which helps send our youth to programs such as Quake and Confirmation Camp;
- Browsed gifts that can help support our neighbors around the world through our Alternative Giving Fair, which raised \$246 for Daybreak Shelter;
- Welcomed Karina Barlow as our new Director of Youth Ministries;
- Created a dedicated space off the Church Hall for Circle, our senior high youth group;
- Began renovating our tech closet and unused closet space into a new office, which will allow our Director of Youth Ministries to have a space closer to the staff offices;
- Moved our handbell choirs into a dedicated rehearsal space, which frees space in our music room for our growing Sanctuary Choir;
- Created opportunities for fellowship (and friendly competition!) at our Third Annual Chili Cook-Off, Thanksgiving pie fellowship, Bread Breakers groups, and Sunday morning Welcome Center chats;
- Welcomed our preschool families to LLP's annual Christmas parties and programs, where they heard the Christmas story and celebrated the birth of Christ;
- Heard the Christmas story from our own Sunday School children at their annual Christmas program;
- Prepared our hearts for Christmas with weekly Advent worship services;
- Rejoiced at the birth of Christ with wonderful music from our Chancel Choir, Celebration Ringers, first-ever Intergenerational Orchestra, soloists, and South Shore Brass Band;
- Continued our commitment to nurture our faith through Sunday School, Faith Formation Hour classes, Confirmation, Fusion, Circle, book groups, and Bible studies;
- Celebrated baptisms and welcomed new families into our community;
- Provided meeting space for Alcoholics Anonymous, Gamblers Anonymous, Stephen Ministries, and our grief group;
- Repaid \$2,850 borrowed from our restricted funds;
- Raised \$12,079 to share with the ministries of Lutheran World Relief, ELCA World Hunger/Disaster Response, Daybreak Shelter, Gabriel's Horn, and our mission partner Bethel Lutheran in Gary.

2026-2027 Registration is now open for everyone! We have plenty of Beginner AM and PM classes left and some afternoon Young 5/PreK spots.

The classes that will be offered this coming fall are:

- Beginners Tuesday/Thursday AM 8:45-11:15 (\$225/month). 3 & 4 years old. Must be 3 by August 1, 2026
- Beginners 3 Session AM Mon/Wed/Fri 9:00-11:30 (\$275/month). 3 & 4 years old. Should be 3 by Feb. 1, 2026
- Beginners 3 Session PM Mon/Wed/Fri 12:30-3:00 (\$275/month). 3 & 4 years old. Should be 3 by Feb. 1, 2026
- Pre-K AM Mon/Wed/Fri 8:45-11:15 (\$250/month) 4 & 5 years old. Must be 4 by August 1, 2026
- Pre-K PM Mon/Wed/Fri 12:15-2:45 (\$250/month) 4 & 5 years old. Must be 4 by August 1, 2026*
- Young 5's AM Mon-Fri 9:00-11:30 (\$357/month) 4 & 5 years old. Should be 4 by June 1, 2026
- Young 5's PM Mon-Fri 12:30-3:00 (\$357/month) 4 & 5 years old. Should be 4 by June 1, 2026*

*Enrollment of up to 16 students in these classes will combine for a split class of PreK/Young 5.

An Extended Day Program will be available for Registration in Fall of 2026 for Spring Semester. Pre-K and Young 5 AM students, who will be attending Kindergarten the following school year, are eligible to enroll.

LLP reserves the right to cancel classes if enrollment is insufficient. A non-refundable registration fee of \$175.00 is due at the time of confirmation of registration. Additional siblings registering for the same school year may pay a reduced registration fee of \$119.00. Once you receive confirmation of registration from LLP you may pay for registration online via a link provided. The registration fee is not due until you receive confirmation that your child has secured a spot for the 2026-2027 school year.

Come when you can. Coffee and Kleenex available.

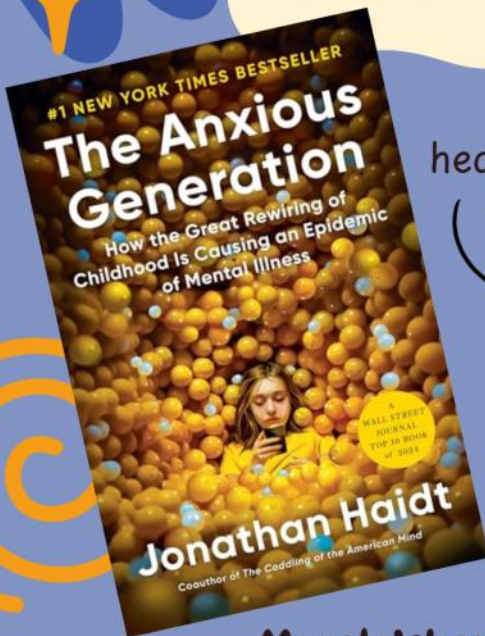

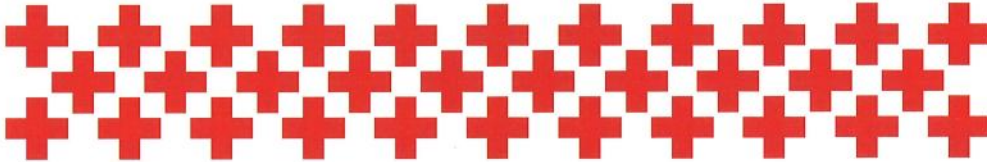

Minimum and maximum Choice Dollars Designations

Eligible clients will be designated a minimum of 25 Choice Dollars and a maximum of 5,000 Choice Dollars per eligibility period (Jan. 1 to Dec. 31).

Choice Dollars designated during the calendar year can be directed **until March 31, 2026.**

There are two ways of directing ***Choice Dollars*** to Christ Lutheran Church:

Phone: Call Thrivent Financial at 1-800-847-4836. When prompted by the electronic answering system, say “***Thrivent Choice.***” Follow the remaining prompts, and a representative will come on the line to assist you. You will need your Thrivent membership ID number and will need to answer some other personal questions to verify that you are the Thrivent member who is on the line.
