• Each month the Social Ministry highlights a special giving opportunity. April's emphasis is providing monetary and voluntary support for **Housing Opportunities**<a href="https://www.hoi.help">www.hoi.help</a> (2001 Calumet Ave., Valpo).

- With the extraordinary support from donors and the dedicated work of staff, Housing Opportunities serves many clients each year. Because of supporters, H.O. in fiscal year 2022 served 1,192 people across all programs. Thousands of hours of housing advocacy are provided to clients each year. Also, H.O. has a resource center for vulnerable folks to shower, wash clothes, use pantry etc.
- We've been through a lot these past few years and while some difficulties are behind us, the return to any sense of normalcy does not provide a sense of relief for our neighbors struggling with homelessness and housing insecurity. Today, there are 129 households in our community who do not have secure homes or a warm place to sleep at night, who are having to choose between paying the bills and putting food on the table.



- 1. Go to our website: <a href="www.clcvalpo.org">www.clcvalpo.org</a>. Under the "Give" menu, select "Give Now." This will take you to the church's mail giving page.
- 2. In the top right corner of that page, you'll see an icon that looks like the head and shoulders of a person. Click that, and then click sign in. You will be prompted to sign into your account using email, Facebook, of Apple. Choose the option that you originally used to setup your account (for most people, that will be email).
  - •Email: Log in with your email address as your user ID and your password. If you have forgotten your password, click on "Forgot Password," and a link to reset it will be sent to your email.
  - •Facebook and Apple: You will be automatically signed in by your device.
- 3. Click the person icon at the top right of the screen, then click "Recurring Gifts." You should see your current setup displayed on the screen. Click the arrow to the right of the displayed gift. This will open a window that allows you to make any changes to your current setup.
- 4. When you are finished, be sure to scroll all the way down to the bottom and click the large purple button that says "Save and Update Gift."

### Camp Lutherwald June 11-16, 2023 Information Letter #3

As summer draws near and schedules are finalizing, I hope you will consider sending your child for a transformative week at Camp Lutherwald in Howe, Indiana. Every year, our CLC kids have the chance to spend a week deepening their faith, friendships, and having a life-changing experience at Camp Lutherwald!

#### What is Confirmation Camp?

Confirmation Camp is a 5-day program that invites our incoming 6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup>, and outgoing 8<sup>th</sup> graders into a deeper exploration of their relationships with God, each other, and nature. The camp staff works alongside church staff to bring learning, games, activities, and worship opportunities every day!

#### What is Servant Leader Camp?

Servant Leader Camp is a 5-day program that invites our incoming 10<sup>th</sup>, 11<sup>th</sup>, and 12<sup>th</sup> graders to deepen their faith, serve in practical ways, and hone their leadership skills. High school campers also get to participate in portions of the 'traditional' camp programs in the afternoon and evenings! (Note: Graduating seniors cannot attend this camp)

#### What's the schedule?

This year's camp dates are June 11<sup>th</sup> – June 16<sup>th</sup>. Check-in begins on Sunday, June 11<sup>th</sup> in the afternoon and programming begins that evening. On weekdays, Confirmation campers spend the mid-morning with their pastors and adult leaders, who lead discussions and activities to teach and deepen your child's understanding of Jesus and faith. Servant Leaders spend this time in participating in Bible studies and service projects around camp.

The afternoons are spent participating in structured activities. Evenings involve large group games and a time for worship and reflection. Check-out begins Friday, June 16<sup>th</sup>, after the last program in early afternoon. Carpool transportation (to and from Camp Lutherwald) is available. Families may provide transportation themselves.

- 1. Fill out the LOMIK paperwork attached to the Confirmation Camp e-mail
  - a. Summer Camp Registration Form
  - b. Camper Information Form
  - c. Camper Health Form instructions: this form should be turned in to camp staff during camp check-in on Sunday, June 11. If your child is carpooling, you may send the form with CLC staff.
- 2. Fill out the CLC Onboarding Form
- 3. Turn in all forms (except the Camper Health Form) and a \$100 deposit payment to Christ Lutheran Church. Normal registration ends on April 30<sup>th</sup>, 2023. Late registration ends on May 11<sup>th</sup>.

#### FOOD:

- <u>Dinner:</u> We will be using our "Take Them a Meal" website account to schedule Saturday evening meals. The site is an easy way to sign up for providing meals to our guests. You can find a friend and share the making or providing of a meal, or it can be an opportunity for a family event. Come with your meal, serve our guests, and share some fellowship with them (usually 12-25 men). <u>Please consider trying one of these shifts if you never have.</u> We will pair you with a partner who has experience working the shift. All shifts require that at least one man be present during the hours we provide services to our guests. We have three supervision shifts each Saturday to Sunday for 26 weeks from April 15th through October 11th. We will start the availability and scheduling process after April 1. Watch for sign-ups in the Gathering Space on Sunday mornings in March and April. Training will be provided in late March or early April.

Intake and evening shift: 6:30 pm -- 10:00 pm

- Late evening and overnight shift: 10:00 pm -- 2:30 am
- Early morning and breakfast shift: 2:30 am -- 7:00 am
- Meals are served from 7:10-8:00 pm; doors generally open at 6:30 for volunteers to set up. Our guests are admitted at 7:00 pm unless weather causes us to open earlier.
