### CLC Social Ministry and Mission February 2023

Social Ministry Emphasis for February is Hilltop House <a href="https://www.hilltophouse.org">https://www.hilltophouse.org</a>



February's emphasis is to provide monetary and volunteer support for Hilltop House and Hilltop Food Pantry. HH is located "on a hill" in a neighborhood west of Valparaiso U. where social service needs are real for the families and children living there. HH can provide as a health care

provider Medicare and Hoosier Healthwise benefits to those in Porter County living below the poverty level (estimated to be 9000 children and 4000 women in Porter County). A gift of \$50 permits Hilltop to provide childcare, health care, and community improvement activities within a child's own family setting (also contributions may qualify for Indiana's Neighborhood Assistance Tax Credit).

Help achieve our goal of \$2500 in February (over and above giving combined with CLC's budgeted amount of \$1200). By achieving our goal CLC will help **Hilltop** continue to thrive. # Northwest Indiana African American Alliance (NWIAAA) February 2023 Black history month

A series of Discussions on Reparations and Repair based on reading the book: "The *Color of Law*," by Richard Rothstein

While the Emancipation Proclamation ended legal slavery 160 years ago, the Color of Law explains how federal, state, and local governments in the 20<sup>th</sup> Century deliberately and systematically imposed racial neighborhood segregation with undisguised racial zoning; public housing that purposefully segregated previously mixed communities; subsidies for builders to create whites-only suburbs; tax exemptions for institutions that enforced segregation; and support for violent resistance to African Americans in white Neighborhoods. The result is segregated and unequal education and the ability of whites to build generational wealth through home ownership which is denied to Blacks.

This will transform our understanding of twentieth- century urban history and force us to face the obligation to remedy our unconstitutional past.



Dear siblings in Christ,

Christ Lutheran Church is a place that makes a difference in our lives and the lives of people in Valparaiso and far beyond. This is only possible because of you and your faithful support! Thanks to your giving, our congregation accomplished our intent to **Live Bold** in 2022:

- Our investment in Worship Opportunities created opportunities for more people to share their gifts in worship!
  - o Sixteen students participated in our Christmas Eve orchestra.
  - Twelve students shared solo and small ensemble pieces throughout the year.
  - Four handbell choirs, including a newly-formed Youth Handbell choir for teenagers, presented music in worship.
  - o Thirty people offered their voices to our Sanctuary Choir.
  - Professional musicians enhanced our festival services on Easter,
     Pentecost, Reformation, and Christmas.
- Our investment in Sustaining Ministry Excellence enabled our staff to continue offering high-quality programming to our congregation and community!
  - o \$19,060 received by our preschool from Early Learning Indiana funded re-branding, new logos, an updated website with more robust streaming capabilities, and our first-ever Christ Lutheran Church app.
  - o Ten to fifteen youth attended our high school group, Circle, each week.
  - Ten to twenty kids attended our middle school group, Fusion, each week.
  - o Fifty children attended our in-person Vacation Bible School.
  - Eleven Stephen Ministers offer support to our congregation and community, and five additional Stephen Ministers have begun training.
  - o Fourteen new members were welcomed into our ministry.
  - o Six children were baptized, and eight teenagers were confirmed.
- Our investment in Property maintenance ensured that our facilities were ready to support our ministries!
  - \$19,920 received by our preschool from Early Learning Indiana funded a much-needed Teacher Prep Room, which gives our teachers and assistants their own space outside of the classrooms.
  - \$1,500 received from NIPSCO funded an expansion of our Bioswale Project.
  - o Five guests, who would have been out on the street, sheltered in our building during the Christmas blizzard and cold snap. Countless volunteers from our congregation and community provided meals, snacks, supplies, and companionship.
  - Guests from New Creation Men's Center lodged in our building every Saturday night for six months. Again, countless volunteers from our congregation and community allowed this ministry to thrive.

All of this happens because you respond to God's abundance with generosity. Thank you for being faithful stewards of God's blessings. **Because of you, this church changes lives!**

Sure you are—you live in NWI! But what do you do? You reach for a blanket to put over you!



Three years ago, one could easily find flannel for less that \$3.00 per yard to make those blankets. Now? Not so much. Flannel, along with everything else, has gone up in price. Thus, this program can use your support.
