The assembly is seated.


DISTRIBUTION

When finished you may leave individually without being dismissed. **Wine** is received either by Common Cup or from individual glasses in trays. For those requiring it for health reasons, **GRAPE JUICE** is dark and in the center of each tray. **USED GLASSES** are to be placed in the basket located near the ramp. **GLUTEN-FREE BREAD IS AVAILABLE**, please indicate to the server that you require this option.

Patty and Jerry have made wine together out of their vineyard for many years, and today's Communion wine is the product of their hands. Jerry and grandson Gavin baked the bread for our celebration.
