

Life Group Lesson Outline

Now My Eyes Have Seen Him Week 5

Date of sermon given: February 15, 2026

Icebreaker (10-15 minutes)

Purpose: Encourage fellowship and set a comfortable tone.

Example Questions:

- What is your high and low for the week?
 - What are some things that gave you joy this week?
 - What are some things that gave you sadness this week?
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Lesson / Discussion (30-40 minutes)

Opening Scripture Reading: Job 38 & 39

Theme = Job wrestles with intense suffering and concludes life is meaningless when discipline and faith bring no protection, arguing that senseless evil and the prosperity of the wicked show life lacks purpose. God answers that chaos is part of creation, limited and woven into a meaningful whole—suffering is not always punishment, some evil must be opposed, and chaos also reveals and shapes human character and courage.

Question 1 = Which of Job’s three reasons for despair (unjust suffering, natural chaos, the prosperity of the wicked) resonates most with you, and why?

Question 2 = How does the idea that “chaos has a meaningful place in creation” change the way you view personal suffering or global tragedies?

Question 3 = Where should believers draw the line between finding meaning in suffering and refusing to justify or minimize evil that must be opposed?

Question 4 = Can you share a story where struggle or chaos revealed or developed someone’s character—what did that teach you about God or humanity?

Reflection / Prayer = Take some time to pray for each other and our church.

Prayer Requests (10-30 minutes)

- Invite group members to share prayer needs. It would be good for the Leader to start this sharing time.
- Close with prayer, praying for each request. (if they are comfortable, rotate who prays for the group)
