Camp Siloam is a long-standing *Christian summer camp and retreat center* located in Siloam Springs, Arkansas, where campers encounter faith, build friendships, and grow spiritually in a fun outdoor setting. Rooted in a mission to help young people discover their identity in **Jesus Christ** and their purpose in His kingdom, Camp Siloam blends exciting activities with Bible teaching and worship throughout the summer weeks. Each year, campers enjoy traditional camp experiences in the Ozark foothills — from swimming, rec games, and creek time to meaningful small groups and large-group worship — all designed to create lasting memories and deepen their faith.

Where will campers sleep ?

Church groups stay together (separated by gender) in a bunkhouse for the whole week. Each bunkhouse has 24 beds and a bathroom with 3 showers, 3 toilets and 3 sinks. All of our bunkhouses are Air Conditioned. Camp Siloam is working to make facilities ADA accessible; however most of the facilities are not ADA accessible at this time.

Counselors

The role of a counselor is to shepherd campers through the camp week; leading group discussion after worship services, participating in games, and making sure campers are at activities, meals and worship services.

Cost for Camp Siloam.

- \$50.00 deposit at registration
- \$75.00 before we leave for camp on July 13th
- TOTAL CAMP COST PER CAMPER = \$125.00

What about medication ?

Camp Siloam has a fully stocked first aid station for common over-the-counter needs. Campers must bring prescription medications in their original containers along with a completed and signed Medication Check-In Form (available from Michael R. Davis). Please send only the amount needed for the week. Any required daily over-the-counter medications should also be included.

Place all medications in a large zip-lock bag labeled with the camper's name and date of birth. Upon arrival at camp, campers will turn all medication in to the group leader.

Spending Money

Campers are encouraged to bring \$30-\$60 for snacks, camp store purchases, or the Thursday night missions offering. All lodging, meals, and activities are included in the camp cost, so spending money is optional and not required to have a great experience.

**Note: At Camp Siloam, lodging, meals, and activities are included in the price of camp. Even a camper who may not be able to have any money in their pocket when they arrive is going to have a great time!*

Who are the Staff ?

Camp Siloam administration hires around 85-90 college students to operate camp during the summer. We screen and hire students at regional colleges who have a passion for youth ministry, are positive role models for youth, and are gifted in the specific jobs we have available at camp. Camp Siloam staffers cook, clean, act, sing, dance, cheer, shout, play, conduct the worship and lead games. Camp staffers stay in separate staff housing from the campers.

Health & Safety

Camp Siloam & Trinity Baptist Church recognizes that the health and safety of a child while they are away from home is of utmost concern to parents. Camp Siloam will provide as much information as it can about health and safety practices so parents can rest assured their children will be safe at Siloam. Church Camp Guidelines

1. Christ-Honoring Conduct

Camp is a spiritual experience. Students are expected to demonstrate Christ-like behavior in speech, attitude, and actions at all times (Ephesians 4:29).

2. Respect for Leadership & Camp Staff

Students must follow the instructions of church leaders, cabin leaders, and Camp Siloam staff promptly and respectfully.

3. Stay With the Group

Students may not leave their assigned group without permission from a church leader. The buddy system should be followed at all times.

4. Dress Code

The Bible says people are to dress modestly. The intent is to not bring attention to how one looks, but to highlight our walk of faith, love, and pursuit of holiness. Camp Siloam requests each camper, whether a guy or girl, to be humble and modest in the way they dress during camp.

Specifically, Camp Siloam requests the following:

- No 'short shorts.' Shorts must extend to the campers' fingertips.
- No spaghetti strap shirts, no racer back tops or visible bras.
- No 2-piece bathing suits for girls, and no speedos for guys. Tankinis are okay if the top overlaps the bottom.
- No deep cut tank tops for guys or gals. No sagging pants or shorts. Tears in jeans should be modest.
- No yoga pants, tights, or leggings worn as pants. If worn, they must also wear shorts and/or a top that extends to or past the fingertips.
- No skater skirts.

If Church leadership or Camp staff considers something worn to be inappropriate, students will be ask to change. This request should be met with compliance.

Message from Bro. Michael R. Davis concerning dress code: *"Please do not test this policy. I do not want to have to police clothing. Key words to remember when selecting clothes to wear at camp: complete coverage, baggy, and Christ-honoring. Clothing is to cover-up nakedness not reveal nakedness."*

5. Electronics Policy

Cell phones are permitted but should not distract from worship, services, or group activities.

When we arrive at camp, church leadership will take mobile devices (cell phones, ipads, etc.) and secure them (lock box). Students will have designated times when they will have access to their mobile devices.

6. No Prohibited Items

Weapons, tobacco, vaping products, alcohol, drugs, fireworks, or inappropriate materials are strictly prohibited.

7. Cabin Conduct

Students are expected to respect quiet hours, keep cabins reasonably clean, and show consideration toward cabin mates.

8. Financial Responsibility

Students are responsible for their own spending money and personal belongings. Our church is not responsible for lost items.

9. Spiritual Participation

All students are expected to attend worship services, small groups, and scheduled activities unless excused by a leader.

10. Consequences

Failure to follow these guidelines may result in a call to parents and possible early dismissal from camp at the family's expense.
