EXPECTANT *Stories of Legends & Legacies of Faith*

What can we learn from the young boy's willingness to give his small amount of food to Jesus? How does this challenge your perspective on giving and what would it look like for you to begin placing that which you might believe is insignificant in the hands of Jesus?

The young boy had the choice to keep his food for himself or give it to Jesus. How do we sometimes struggle with holding onto things instead of surrendering them to God? What fears or doubts keep us from trusting Him?

Jesus' disciples saw the situation as impossible, but the boy simply offered what he had. How does this contrast between logic and faith challenge the way we approach problems in our own lives?

Jesus took what seemed insignificant and made it more than enough. Can you think of a time when God used something small in your life to make a big impact? How did it grow your faith?

The story emphasizes trusting God and taking steps of obedience, no matter how small. What are some areas in your life where you feel God calling you to trust Him more? What steps of faith might He be prompting you to take?

At the end of the miracle, there were twelve baskets of leftovers. What does this teach us about God's provision? How does this encourage us to step out in faith even when we feel like we don't have enough?

Prayer Prompt:

Lord, thank You for being a God of abundance and provision. Just as You took the small offering of the young boy and multiplied it beyond what anyone could imagine, help us to trust You with what we have. Give us faith to surrender our time, talents, and resources into Your hands, knowing that You can do immeasurably more than we could ever ask or think. Strengthen us to take steps of obedience, no matter how small, and remind us that when we trust You, nothing is ever wasted. In Jesus' name, Amen.
