Snow

Snowfalls are rare in Jerusalem but are common in the Golan Heights (the area called Bashan in the Bible) as well as on Mt. Hermon. Yet it snowed four years ago in Jerusalem (18 Feb. 2021 <https://www.newzpick.com/2021/02/18/in-pictures-jeruselems-old-city-turns-white-after-rare-snowfall/>).

Sometimes the snowfalls are heavy. In Feb. 1950, Jerusalem had 24” of snow. Twelve years ago in Dec. 2013, it snowed 12” in Jerusalem but a few miles south that same time, it snowed 40” (3.3 feet of snow) in a village named Kefar Etzion.

There are 25 references in Bible to snow. Only a handful refer to literal snow. Most references involve comparisons to snow.

2 Sam. 23:20 tells of one of David’s bodyguards, Benaiah, who was so skilled that he killed 2 lions of Moab (2 Sam. 23:20). The lions are thought to have been warriors who were lion-like, e.g. like Navy Seals. Then, he killed a lion that was in a pit on a snowy day.

The book of Job has several references to snow. Job 9:30 refers to one washing in snow water to make himself clean. Young Elihu said to Job that he needed to acknowledge God’s greatness because God commanded weather patterns including rain & snow (Job 37:6). God asked Job if he knew about the storehouses of snow (Job 38:22). Job’s silence meant that he did not know.

The worthy woman in Prov. 31 had her family dressed for cold weather & was not afraid of the snow (Prov. 31:21).

Isa. 55:10 shows that God’s word is like the glacial snowmelt that feeds rivers in the hot summer.

The Holy Spirit compared several things to snow. When Moses was not sure about God’s power to deliver Israel from Egypt, God commanded Moses to put his hand in his garment. When he removed it, his hand was snowy white with leprosy, and upon putting his hand the second time, everything was normal (Ex. 4:6). Other passages tell of leprosy that was as white as snow (Num. 12:10; 2 Kgs. 5:27)

God’s majesty & glory is as white as snow. Dan. 7:9 describes Jesus, the Son of Man appearing before the Ancient of Days (God) to be crowned King of Kings, & His clothing was as white as snow. When Jesus was transfigured, His clothing was as white as snow (Mk. 9:3). Later, John saw the glorified Christ, he noted that Jesus’ hair was as white as snow (Rev. 1:14).

God’s grace is like snow. After Nathan’s rebuke of David’s adultery & murder of Bathsheba’s husband, the king asked God, “wash me & I will be whiter than snow” (Psa. 51:7). God pleaded with rebellious Israel to reason with Him. God offered to forgive them if they repented. “Though your sins shall be as scarlet, they can be as white as snow” (Isaiah 1:18).

Psalms 148 invites all of creation to praise the LORD. Verse 8 mentions that God commands the weather and then lightning, hail, fog, strong winds, and snow all fulfill God’s word.

We all can be clean in God’s sight if we accept the forgiveness offered on Calvary.

Our salvation requires us to act (1:5). We need mercy, but we must respond to the call of God with faith. Our salvation is often on the “other side” of suffering (6-7). The trials we face lead to joy and demonstrate the genuineness of our faith.

Our salvation is centered around Jesus (1:8-9). The reward for submission to the Lord we’ve never physically seen is the salvation of our souls.

Our salvation is of interest to prophets and angels (1:10-12). The Plan of Salvation is so amazing it merits the attention the heavenly host.
