Pastor's Notes:

What, in your opinion, is the best way to achieve church growth?

There is only one way that the church grows, and that is by the preaching of the Word of God.

So shall My word be that goes forth from My mouth;

It shall not return to Me void,

But it shall accomplish what I please,

And it shall prosper in the thing for which I sent it. (Isaiah 55:11)

It was the command of Jesus Christ at His ascension that the job of the church is to preach and to baptize all nations.

And Jesus came and spoke to them, saying, "All authority has been given to Me in heaven and on earth. Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all things that I have commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age." Amen. (Matthew 28:18-20)

We learn in the Small Catechism that when we pray "thy kingdom come" that we are praying for the Holy Spirit to come to us by the word of God "so that by His grace we may believe His holy Word and lead a godly life here in time and there in eternity." The kingdom of grace, as Christ comes in this life, is a kingdom that grows by preaching, baptizing, and believing.

Personal spiritual growth comes from hearing and delighting in the Word of God.

He shall be like a tree

Planted by the rivers of water,

That brings forth its fruit in its season,

Whose leaf also shall not wither;

And whatever he does shall prosper. (Psalm 1:3)

Christians must constantly be reading and hearing God's Word. We speak God's Word to one another, we teach our children, and we speak God's Word to people we know outside the church. It is only by the Word of God that the Holy Spirit makes more Christians.

And these words which I command you today shall be in your heart. You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, when you walk by the way, when you lie down, and when you rise up. You shall bind them as a sign on your hand, and they shall be as frontlets between your eyes. You shall write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates. (Deuteronomy 6:6-9)

Now there are two ways in which the Word of God has come to be preached to new people to make them Christians. The primary way the church has grown historically is by having children, teaching them and raising them in faith. This is seen in the command from Deuteronomy 6, above. Abraham taught Isaac the faith, and Isaac taught Jacob. David taught Solomon. In the New Testament, Timothy was taught by his mother and grandmother (2 Timothy 1:5). Paul tells men to teach their wives and children at home (1 Corinthians 14:35). When parents get baptized, so do whole households (Acts 16:15, 33). These “new people” who come into our lives need to be raised in discipline and taught the scriptures from a young age. Don’t think the evangelism of your own children is not important because it’s not preaching to someone far away!

The church has also evangelized their neighbors. As above in Matthew 28, Jesus commands the apostles to go to “all nations.” The book of Acts is filled with too many examples to counts of evangelism toward our neighbors. These may be people whom we interact with every day and know well, who are a lot like us (Acts 3 – the apostles preached to the other Jews in Jerusalem where they resided), or people who we see seldom and are very different from us (Acts 8:26-39 – Philip preached to an Ethiopian eunuch who was traveling back from Jerusalem).

Both are necessary and commanded by God. This may or may not cause a particular congregation to grow in membership or attendance. We all have experienced that people reject the gospel, both inside and outside our own families. This should not lead us to despair. We should watch and pray and never give up, always speaking the truth in love. Remember, the church overall is always growing, as more Christians are added to the number of those on earth and saints in heaven.

Stand therefore, having girded your waist with truth, having put on the breastplate of righteousness, and having shod your feet with the preparation of the gospel of peace; above all, taking the shield of faith with which you will be able to quench all the fiery darts of the wicked one. And take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God; praying always with all prayer and supplication in the Spirit, being watchful to this end with all perseverance and supplication for all the saints (Ephesians 6:14-18).
